

## Regular Meeting of the Council.

Canby, Oregon, September, 13th 1920.

Council called to order at 8 O'clock P.M. by Mayor A.H. Knight.  
 Present Mayor Knight, Recorder C.N. Wait, Marshall C.E. Bowman City  
 Attorney P.L. Hammond, and Councilmen Combs, Dedman, Evans, Sandsness,  
 White and Slyter. Minutes of previous meeting read and approved  
 as read. A report was made by the City Attorney that the City should  
 have a record of bond issues, and that the same is kept by the  
 City Treasurer, and that the cost of said Record would be about  
 \$25. Moved, seconded and carried that the Treasurer should provide  
 the necessary record book. The following claims against the City  
 were then presented, read and upon motion duly made, seconded and  
 carried were ordered paid and warrants ordered drawn for the same  
 On the motion these voting yes were Councilmen Combs, Dedman, Evans,  
 Sandsness, White and Slyter, Six; Voting No None.

XII It was moved seconded and carried that the Recorder have a notice published calling for bids for the proposed Street improvements, said bids to be filed with the City Recorder on or before October 4th 1920, and to come up before the Council to be opened on that date. The Mayor asked permission of the Council to have the use of part of the street adjacent to his residence to pile his wood on until he could get it saved, upon motion duly made and seconded the permission asked was granted. The Mayor handed to the Council his vote of the Ordinance regulating the punishment of disorderly conduct in Canby, and passed by the Council on August 3rd, 1920. Mr E.C. Robinson made a statement to the Council claiming that he could not continue to furnish electric lights to Canby at the present rates unless the light system should be placed on a switch system, and stated that the probable cost of changing the system would be about \$531.50, It was suggested that the Committee on Streets and public property investigate the matter and report at the next meeting. The Mayor stated that a moving picture man wanted to rent the City Hall for a picture show, it was moved seconded and carried that the matter be referred to Councilman H.B. Evans with power to act in the matter. The following Resolution was then introduced and read by the City Recorder, and upon motion duly seconded was adopted by the Council, those voting yes on the motion to adopt were Councilmen, Combs, Nedman, Evans, Sandsness, White and Slyter, those voting No: None.



## RESOLUTION.

A resolution providing for the construction of a concrete sidewalk four feet wide on the West side of C Street from the South line of First Street to the South or most easterly line of Popular Street and on the South or most easterly line of Popular Street from the West line of C Street to the easterly line of Woods Addition to Canby, and providing for an emergency.

Whereas the Council of Canby has heretofore passed a resolution declaring its purpose of making the hereinafter described improvement and due notice was thereafter given of call for bids for the construction of a concrete sidewalk four feet wide on the West side of C Street from the South line of First Street to the South or most easterly line of Popular Street and on the South or most easterly line of Popular Street from the West line of C Street to the easterly line of Woods Addition to Canby, and providing for an emergency.

Whereas the City of Canby has received no satisfactory bids for the construction of the work as provided for in the plans and specifications heretofore adopted, now then, therefore,

Be it resolved by the City of Canby,

That the construction of the improvement shall be made by and under the direction and supervision of the City of Canby by the Street Superintendent in the same manner as if said improvement had been let by contract.

Provided that the property owners whose property abuts on the proposed improvement shall have the right to make the said proposed improvement under the direction and superintendent of Streets of Canby, on or before the 4th day of October.

That immediately after the 4th day of October, the Street Superintendent shall proceed with the said improvement and complete the same in accordance with the plans and specifications heretofore adopted. There being no further business Council adjourned.
