The fellewing Ordinance fixing the CityBudget for the year 1921, was then read for the third time and passed by the Council the vote on the passage thereof being Yeas; 3ix. Nays; None.

ORDINANCE NO

An Ordinance for the purpose of levying a tax on all taxable property, both real and personal, within Camby and declaring an emergency.

CAMBY TOES ORTAIN AS FOLLOWS: EAST WEST OF

MINT STORAY

levy a tax of \$4615.00 on all the taxable property, both real and personal, which is taxable for County and State purposes, within the comporate limits of Camby. Which is to be collected as other taxes are collected in the State of Oregon, by the sheriff and tax collector of Clackamas County, during the year 1921, with the taxes commonly known as the taxes 6 1920. Said levy shall consist of \$2838.00, known

as the regular City Tax and \$1780.00, special taxed heretofore approve by the votes of Canty. Section 2. Whereas it is neccessary that Camby shall raise the sum of money aforesaid to meet the expenses of the City and protect the health and safety of the inhabents thereof, an emergency is hereby declared to exhist and this ordinance shall go into full force and effect upon its final passage and approval by the Mayor. Read for the first time at a regular meeting of the Council held on November 1st, 1920, and ordered posted for the reason that the eest of publication thereof was excessive in the epinion of the Council, and to come up for final hearing at a regular meeting of the Council to be held recember 6th, 1920. C.N. Wait. Recorder. Approved December 6th 1920. A.H. Wnight. Mayor. Marshall Bowman informed the Council that the equipment of the City Jail was not sufficient to accomodate the persons who asked to spa end the night therein at the present time, the matter of further equ equipment was referred to the Committe on health and Police to enquire into the matter and act according to their best judgement. It was moved, seconded and carried by a unanimous vote of the Council that the salary of the Water Superint endent be fixed at Ninety five (95.00) dollats per menth. Upon metion Council then adjourned. 6 M. Wait Approved Jan 3 1926 Recorder. Mayor.
