

Canby, Oregon, December, 6th, 1920.

Regular session of City Council.

Council met in regular session and called to order at 8 o'clock P
by A.H. Knight Mayor, there were present Mayor A.H. Knight, Recorder
C.N. Wait, Marshall C.E. Bowman, City Attorney P.L. Hammond, Street Supt
E.C. Shull, and Councilmen Combs, Eld, Evans, Redman, Sandsness and Whit

Minutes of previous meetings read and approved as read.

Marshall Bowman reported that the lights at the German Church and 1
in front of the old Lucke house did not light the street on account
of the way they were placed on the poles and asked that they be
turned so as to throw the light onto the street more, referred to
the committee on streets to act in the matter.

Claim of C.E.Bowman for tools destroyed when the power house burned referred to the Committee on Fire and Water to report on the same at next meeting.

It was duly moved seconded and carried that the salary of Chief of Police be fixed at \$15.00 per month as provided by Ordinance.

The following Ordinance fixing the City Budget for the year 1921, was then read for the third time and passed by the Council the vote on the passage thereof being Yeas; Six. Nays; None.

ORDINANCE NO. _____

An Ordinance for the purpose of levying a tax on all taxable property, both real and personal, within Canby and declaring an emergency.

CANBY DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The Council of the City of Canby does hereby levy a tax of \$4615.00 on all the taxable property, both real and personal, which is taxable for County and State purposes, within the corporate limits of Canby. Which is to be collected as other taxes are collected in the State of Oregon, by the sheriff and tax collector of Clackamas County, during the year 1921, with the taxes commonly known as the taxes of 1920. Said levy shall consist of \$2838.00, known

as the regular City Tax and \$1780.00, special taxed heretofore approved by the voters of Canby.

Section 2. Whereas it is necessary that Canby shall raise the sum of money aforesaid to meet the expenses of the City and protect the health and safety of the inhabitants thereof, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this ordinance shall go into full force and effect upon its final passage and approval by the Mayor.

Read for the first time at a regular meeting of the Council held on November 1st, 1920, and ordered posted for the reason that the cost of publication thereof was excessive in the opinion of the Council, and to come up for final hearing at a regular meeting of the Council to be held December 6th, 1920.

Marshall Bowman informed the Council that the equipment of the City Jail was not sufficient to accommodate the persons who asked to spend the night therein at the present time, the matter of further equipment was referred to the Committee on Health and Police to enquire into the matter and act according to their best judgment.
