

Canby, Oregon, January 5th 1920

Regular meeting of the City Council.

Council met and called to order by the Mayor at 8 o'clock P.M.

Present Mayor A.W. Knight, Recorder C.W. Wait, Marshall C.E. Bowman and Councilmen Bowlby, Dodman, Eid, Evans, Sandsness, Slyter and White.

Minutes of meetings of Dec 1st, 22nd and 29th read and approved as read. Mr E.C. Robinson stated to the Council that on account of not having the necessary time to devote to it he could not act as City Engineer in the matter of the improvement of streets and that he there fore tendered the Council his resignation as City Engineer. Whereupon the resignation of Mr Robinson was accepted. The following claims against the City were then read and ordered paid and warrants drawn for the same.

These voting aye on the foregoing bills were Councilmen Bowlby, Dodman, Eid, Evans, Sandsness, Slyter and White, voting No None.

Upon a motion made by Mr Eld all bill from the General and Road Funds were ordered paid and all bills for labor from the water fund for labor ordered paid and all bills for material and machinery from the Water Fund were held over until they could be referred to Mr Slyter of the water committee and were adjusted also the bill of the State Bank for commissions on water collections. Mr H.C. Gilmore explained to the Council the condition of the street from the telephone exchange to the Tetzleff corner at Fanton Street, and asked the Council to construct some kind of a walk along said street so as to make it passable for pedestrians, whereupon the Committee on Streets and public property was instructed to examine into the matter and do what they thought necessary to improve the same.

Councilman Eid made a motion which was duly seconded that the offer of Mr Aug Rethenberg to pay the City \$175.00. for the lot which the City purchased for a Jail site be accepted and that the City Recorder be instructed to draw up an ordinance to that effect.

The motion was put to the Council and upon a vote being taken was carried and so ordered. Councilman Evans brought up the matter

of having a City Attorney, and made a motion that Philip Hammond be elected City Attorney the motion was duly seconded and upon a vote being taken Mr Hammond was declared so elected as City

Attorney.

Marshall C. E. Bowman told the Council that he did not see how he could continue to serve as Marshall and Supt of the water system for the wages he was getting at present.

Upon motion duly made and seconded the Council adjourned to meet
January 20th 1920, at 8 O'Clock P.M.
