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Canby, Oregon, January 20th 1920.

Special meeting of the Council, Council met and called to order at 8 o'clock P.M. by Mayor A.H. Knight. Present Mayor A.H. Knight, Recorder C.W. Wait, Marshall C.E. Bowman and Councilmen Bowlsby, Redman, Evans, Combs, Sandsness and White. Mr Carrow Civil Engineer then talked to the Council in regard to doing the engineering work for the City for the proposed street improvements, stated that he and his brother who was also an engineer would take charge of the work for the City if the City saw fit to employ them to do so. Spoke of the advantage of getting the plans of any proposed work prepared early so the work could be completed during the good weather of the summer. He stated that their charges for their services would be five per cent of the construction cost, to be divided into two payments to be decided on by them and the Council. The matter was then laid over to come up at the regular meeting of the Council February 2nd 1920. On motion duly made seconded and passed the following Ordinance was ordered read for the third time,

ORDINANCE NO. _____

An Ordinance to amend Ordinance No 133, of the City of Canby, being an Ordinance entitled "An Ordinance adopting rules and regulations for the water works of Canby, providing rates for the consumers of water, making it unlawful to interfere with water mains, pipes, etc., providing a penalty therefor, and declaring an emergency, by which the same becomes immediately operative, by changing rule 15 of section one thereof, and declaring an emergency by which the same may become immediately operative."

CANBY DOES OBTAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section I. Rule 15 of section one, of Ordinance No 133, of the City of Canby, entitled an Ordinance adopting rules and regulations for the water works for Canby, providing rules for the consumers of water, making it unlawful to interfere with the water mains, pipes etc, providing a penalty therefor, and declaring an emergency, by which the same shall become immediately operative, be and the same is hereby repealed and amended, by substitution of the following Rule therefor, The balance of said Ordinance to remain in full force and effect as heretofore.

Rule 15 of section one of said Ordinance, shall hereafter read as follows:

Section 2. Whereas it is necessary for the immediate preservation of the peace, health and safety of the City of Canby, and the inhabitants thereof and therein, that this Ordinance become immediately operative, therefore to preserve the peace, health and safety of the City of Canby and to provide Canby with water works, this Ordinance shall take full force and effect upon being approved by the three fourths of the Council and the Mayor of the City of Canby.
 Read for the first time at an adjourned meeting of the Council of Canby, and approved December 29th 1919, and ordered posted for the reason that the charges of publication thereof, are in the judgment of the Council excessive, and the publication thereof is hereby dispensed with, and that the ordinance is hereby ordered posted in three public and conspicuous places for the period of two full calendar weeks, and to come up for final passage at a special meeting of the Council to be held on the 20th day of January, 1920, at the hour of

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8 o'clock P.M. in the City hall.
