

Regular meeting of City Council.

Council met in regular session at 8 o'clock P.M. March 1st 1920, and called to order by Mayor A.H. Knight.

Present Mayor A.H. Knight, Recorder C.N. Wait, Marshall C.E. Bowman, City Attorney P.L. Hammond, and Councilmen Combs, Evans, Eid, Dedman Sandsness, Slyter and White. Minutes of previous meeting read and approved as read. The following bills against the City were then presented and read and upon motion duly made seconded and carried were ordered paid and warrants drawn for the same, on the motion these voting Aye were all present voting Nay None.

The following Ordinance was then introduced and upon motion duly made seconded and carried was read by the Recorder. AN ORDINANCE ENTITLED AN ORDINANCE, to sell Lot No ten, in block No eight in Canby, Or Oregon. Canby Does Ordain as Follows.

Section One.

That Canby doer propose to sell and transfer to August Rothenberg for the sum of one hundred ~~XXXXXX~~ and seventy five dollars, all it's right, title and interest in and to Lot No ten in block No eight in Canby, Clackamas County, Oregon.

It was moved by Slyter, seconded by Combs and duly carried, that this be considered the first reading of the ordinance, and that it come up for final passage at the next regular meeting of the Council on April 5th, 1920. It was moved seconded and carried that the Ordinance be posted, for the reason that in the judgment of the Council, the cost

of publishing the same was excessive.

The Committee on Streets and Public Property then introduced a resolution signifying the Council's intention to have sidewalks constructed as follows, to wit: Commencing at the Southwest intersection of "C" Street and First Street, and running South on the West side of "C" Street extended to the South West ~~sixth~~ corner of the intersection of "C" Street extended with Poplar Street, and running thence West on the South side of Poplar Street, to the East boundary of Ward's Addition to Canby; the resolution having been read by the Recorder, it was moved by White and seconded by Pedman that the resolution be passed which was then done by a unanimous vote of the Council, and the resolution declared carried.

Upon motion judges and Clerks were appointed for the special election on April 19th 1920, as follows, to wit: Judges T.B. Hamilton and Wilson Evans, Clerks L.H. Wang, Mrs Ida Knight and Mrs Elizabeth White. Moved that the Council take a recess to meet in continued regular session on March 8th at 8 O'clock P.M.

Canby, Oregon, March 8th 1920, at 8 O'clock P.M. Council met in continued regular session and called to order by Mayor A.H. Knight, present Mayor Knight, Recorder C.N. Wait, Marshall C.E. Bowman, City Attorney Philip L. Hammond and Councilmen Combs, Eld, Evans, Sandsness, Pedman, Slyter and White. Mr T.A. Carrow City Engineer was present and submitted to the Council copies of specifications and engineers estimate of cost of different kinds of improvement, together with forms of bonds and contracts, also blue prints of the proposed streets to be improved and their manner of improvement, the bonding Attorneys not having their papers ready to submit to the Council for their consideration the Council took a recess to meet on Monday evening March 15th at 8 O'clock P.M.

Council met on March 15th at 8 O'clock P.M. there not being a quorum present the recess was continued until the evening of March 22nd, 1920, at 8 O'clock P.M.

Canby, Oregon, March 22nd 1920, Council met in continued regular session and called to order at 8 O'clock P.M. Present Mayor A.H. Knight, Recorder C.N. Wait, Marshall C.E. Bowman, City Attorney P.L. Hammond, and Councilmen Eld, Combs, Sandsness, White, Bowlsby, Evans and Pedman.

A resolution was introduced placed on file and ordered read in regard to the specifications as to the kind of cement sidewalks to be laid hereafter in the City, as follows:

RESOLUTION.

RESOLUTION.

IT IS RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CANBY.

That hereafter, all cement sidewalks and curbs constructed within the City of Canby shall be as provided in this resolution, and that the owners, agents or occupants of all property, besides complying with the Charter of the City of Canby and other ordinances or resolutions, shall construct the concrete sidewalks when ordered to do so by the Council of Canby, in accordance with the following specifications:

GRADING:

All grading that may be necessary to be performed shall be done in accordance with specifications prepared by the City Engineer or Street Superintendent, as may be designated by the resolution ordering such improvement.

WATER FOR MIXING.

The water for mixing shall be clean and free from silt, oil, acid, alkali or other injurious matters. Wherever possible, the water used shall be drawn from the City mains.

CONSTRUCTION OF FORMS.

Only sound, unwarped lumber, not less than one and three quarters inches in thickness, planed on two sides and on at least one edge, allowing tight joints shall be used. Upon approval of the City Engineer metal forms may be used. All forms shall be free from dirt and matter, and shall be firmly braced and staked with the upper edges laid true and to line and grade as marked by the City Engineer.

MIXING THE CONCRETE.

The body of the structure shall be composed of a mixture of 1 $\frac{2}{5}$ 5.

If hand mixing be followed, the cement and sand shall be thoroughly mixed in a dry condition and sufficient water then added to obtain the consistency desired, after which the aggregate thoroughly wetted shall be added and the entire mass turned over until all the ingredients shall have been uniformly distributed, each particle of sand being thoroughly coated with cement and each particle of the aggregate being thoroughly coated with mortar. If mechanical mixing be followed, the dry materials in the proportions above specified shall be deposited in the mixer simultaneously. The proper amount of water shall be added and mixing shall continue until a mixture of a uniform consistency is produced, all the ingredients being uniformly distributed throughout the

mass, each particle being coated as above set forth. The subgrade against which concrete is laid shall be thoroughly wetted.

CONSISTENCY OF CONCRETE.

The ingredients of the concrete shall be so mixed as to produce a mortar homogeneous in character and uniform in color and texture, of such a consistency that the mortar will flush to the surface under tamping without separation of the ingredients.

DEPOSITING CONCRETE.

The transportation of concrete from the point of mixing to the point of deposit shall be conducted in such manner that mortar shall not be lost and the concrete shall be so handled that when deposited in place it shall be uniform in composition throughout, showing neither excess nor deficiency of mortar in any part of the mass. If the concrete be transported by wagon or cart, every such vehicle shall have a tight body and the concrete shall be in place within thirty minutes after discharge from the mixer or mixing platform. The length of haul shall not exceed six hundred feet except upon express permission of the City Engineer.

SIDEWALKS:

The sidewalks shall be composed of two layers.

First a three inch base of concrete evenly spread over the sub grade and tamped with iron shod rammers weighing not less than ten pounds, until water flushes to the surface. The upper surface of this course shall be laid parallel to the finished grade and shall be at all times protected from injury through entrance of foreign materials or acts of workmen;

SECOND: A mortar top or wearing course three quarters of one inch in thickness, composed of one part of Portland cement and one and one half parts of sand, which shall be worked into the base by careful troweling while still in a plastic and brought to a surface conforming to grade, but roughened as directed by the City Engineer. The wearing course shall be laid as soon as the base is in condition to permit of proper working.

If the laying of the wearing course be delayed until the base has taken final set or be in a condition unfavorable to a proper bond, the upper surface of the base shall be thoroughly cleaned, and then covered with a thin grout of neat cement which shall be brushed into the base by vigorous scrubbing with a stiff wire brush after which the wearing surface shall be immediately laid.

The wearing surface shall be marked off in blocks as directed by the City Engineer, and as nearly as possible in rectangular form of a length approximately three feet. Such marking shall be made with a tool, cutting entirely through the wearing surface to the base.

RETEMPERING MIXTURE.

The retempering or remixing of mortar or concrete with additional water after partial setting has occurred, is expressly forbidden.

PROTECTION OF WORK.

The mixing of concrete during freezing weather or the laying of wearing surface shall not be permitted. During the summer months the work shall not be permitted to become dry and shall be protected from excessive evaporation by light sprinkling with a nozzle or by other suitable means. The work shall be kept moistened for at least five days or for a longer period if directed by the City Engineer or Street Superintendent, and shall be protected during this entire period from accident due to traffic or otherwise. The barriers protecting the work shall not be removed except upon express permission of the City Engineer or Street Superintendent, and until they be permitted to be removed the work shall not be thrown open to use. That the Street Superintendent may be designated to perform all acts herein required to be done by City Engineer, whenever the Council of Canby so direct.

WHEREAS, it is necessary for the immediate preservation of the peace, health and safety of the City of Canby and the citizens thereof that this resolution go into immediate force and effect, an emergency is hereby declared, and this resolution shall go into full force and effect upon being duly approved by the Council and Mayor.

After the reading of the foregoing Resolutionⁿ it was duly moved and seconded that the Resolution be passed by the Council, upon a vote being taken on the passage of the Resolution there were seven votes for the passage of the resolution and none against. Whereupon the Resolution was declared passed, whereupon the Resolution was approved and signed by the Mayor.

Whereupon the following Resolutions of the intention of the City Council to improve the following Streets in Canby were introduced and read by the Recorder, after which reading it was moved by Councilman Eid and seconded by Councilman Combs that the resolution be passed by the Council, upon a vote being taken the following Council men voted Aye: Eid, Combs, Sandsness, White, Bewlsby, Evans and Dedman: Seven. voting Nay, None, whereupon the resolution was declared carried and was at once approved and signed by the Mayor, whereupon by motion duly made, seconded and carried the Recorder was ordered to have the resolutions published at Canby, Oregon, in the Clackamas County News and also to post true and correct copies of the same in three public and conspicuous places within the corporate limits of Canby said notices to be posted for fourteen full days continuously
