

Canby, Oregon, May 10th, 1920.

The regular meeting of the City Council on May 3rd 1920, was not held on account of lack of a quorum and these present adjourned to meet in regular session on May 10th 1920.

Council met in regular session and was called to order at eight O'clock P.M. by Mayor A.H. Knight, Present Mayor Knight, Recorder C.N. Wait, Marshall C.E. Bowman, City Attorney P.L. Hammond and Councilmen Combs, Eld, Bowlshy, Sandsness, Tedman, White and Slyter.

Minutes of five previous meetings read and approved as read.

The City Treasurers report on the Water Fund was received and read and upon motion was referred to the finance Committee.

The following claims against the City were then presented and on motion duly made and seconded were ordered paid and warrants drawn for the same. There were eight votes in favor of the motion and none against .

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The Clackamas County News bill for printing notices of proposed street improvements was ordered laid over.

Upon motion duly seconded the bids for the purchase of the Seven thousand five hundred dollars Water bonds were opened, read and upon motion referred to a committee consisting of Councilmen Medman, Evans and Edite take action on the bids according to their best judgment and report the same to the Council, there were two bids submitted to the Council for said bonds, one by Clarke Kendall and Co, the other by Keeler Brothers, the one submitted by Keeler Bros contained no certified check.

This being the time set for hearing remonstrances to the proposed improvement of "C" Street and Second Street as herein set forth, the Recorder reported that there had been no remonstrances to the said improvement filed or given to him or in his office, whereupon the Council adopted and passed the following Resolutions of proposed improvements, to wit;

## RESOLUTION OF INTENTION.

WHEREAS, the Council of the City of Canby deems it expedient and necessary to improve

Second Street from the Northerly line of "B"

Street to the Southerly line of "C" Street

by grading, draining, shouldering, curbing where necessary, and paving with hard surface pavement 16 and 1 feet in width as per revised plans and specifications on file in the Recorder's office, and by doing such other work as will be necessary to make a full and complete improvement at an estimated cost, according to the City surveyor's estimates, of eight thousand, eight hundred and ninety five dollars, and

WHEREAS, it has heretofore required from the City Surveyor revised plans and specifications and estimates of the work to be done and the probable cost thereof; and

WHEREAS, the City Surveyor has heretofore filed such rev



used plans, specifications and estimates in the office of the Recorder, and

WHEREAS, the Council has examined and found such revised plans, specifications and estimates to be satisfactory; now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CANBY that it is hereby declared to be its intention to improve

Second Street from the Northerly line of "B" Street

to the Southerly line of "L" Street

by grading, draining, shouldering, curbing where necessary, and paving with hard surface paving sixteen and eighteen feet in width and by doing such other work as will be necessary to make a full and complete improvement; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the City Surveyor's revised plans, specifications and estimates for the said improvements are hereby declared to be satisfactory and are hereby approved and adopted, which said revised plans, specifications and estimates are on file in the office of the City Recorder and there subject to inspection; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this resolution of the Council declaring its purpose to improve the aforesaid street shall be kept of record in the office of the Recorder and shall be published by posting three copies thereof in three public places in said City at least fifteen days before the time set herein, to wit: the eighth day of May 1920, as the last day in which a remonstrance against said proposed improvement may be filed; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that within fifteen days after the posting of this resolution the resident owners or their agents representing property abutting upon said street or the part thereof proposed to be improved, which said property is to be assessed for the cost of said improvement, may make and file with the Recorder a written remonstrance against the proposed improvement, ("owner as herein used shall be construed to mean the legal title holder, and abutting property shall be construed to mean between the street and center of the block; in blocks having an alley parallel with the street "abutting" shall mean to the line of the alley nearest the street, and in tracts not laid out in blocks "abutting" shall mean within a line 100 feet back from the street) which said remonstrances will be considered by the Council at a special meeting called for May

10, 1920.

#### RESOLUTION OF INTENTION.

WHEREAS, the Council of the City of Canby deems it expedient and necessary to improve

C Street from the westerly line of First Street  
to the westerly line of Third Street

by grading, draining, shouldering, curbing, where necessary, and paving with hard surface pavement sixteen and eighteen feet in width as shown on the revised plans and specifications, and by doing such other work as will be necessary to make a full and complete improvement at an approximate cost, according to the City Surveyor's estimates, of \$5994.00; and

WHEREAS, it has heretofore required from the City Surveyor revised plans and specifications and estimates of the work to be done and the probable cost thereof; and

WHEREAS, the City Surveyor has heretofore filed such revised



plans, specifications and estimates in the office of the Recorder and

WHEREAS the Council has examined and found such revised plans, specifications and estimates to be satisfactory; now therefore

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CANBY that it is hereby declared to be its intention to improve

C Street from the westerly line of First Street to the westerly line of Third Street by grading, draining, shouldering, curbing, where necessary, and paving with hard surface pavement sixteen and eighteen feet in width as shown on plans and specifications, and by doing such other work as will be necessary to make a full and complete improvement; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this resolution of the Council declaring its purpose to improve the aforesaid Street shall be kept of record in the office of the Recorder and shall be published by posting three copies thereof in three public places in said City at least fifteen days before the time set herein, to wit the eighth day of May, 1920, as the last day in which a remonstrance against said proposed improvement may be filed; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that within fifteen days after the posting of this resolution the resident owners or their agents representing property abutting upon said street or the part thereof proposed to be improved, which said property is to be assessed for the cost of said proposed improvement, may make and file with the Recorder a written remonstrance against the proposed improvement ("owner" as herein used shall be construed to mean the legal title holder, and "abutting" property shall be construed to mean between the street and center of the block; in blocks having an alley parallel with the street "abutting" shall mean to the line of the alley nearest the street, and in tracts not laid out in blocks "abutting" shall mean within a line 100 feet back from the street) which said remonstrance will be considered by the Council at a special meeting called for May 10th, 1920.

The following persons were then appointed for Judges and Clerks for the special City Election to be held June seventh 1920, to wit Judges: T. B. Hamilton and Warren Kendall, Clerks L. H. Wang, Mrs Ida Knight and Mrs Elizabeth White.

A representative of the S. P. R'y was present and addressed the Council, stating the position of the R'y Co on the proposed Street improvements, he stated that it was the opinion of the R'y Co, that it would be much better to postpone the proposed improvement as they thought in the near future the price of labor and material would be so much cheaper that a great saving would be made by both the City and the R'y Co.

The Recorder stated to the Council that by reason of lack of time to properly perform the duties of the office he at this time tenders to the Council his resignation as City Recorder.

Upon motion the Council adjourned to meet May 17th 1920, when the Bond Attorneys would have some matters to lay before the Council.
