Supt Bowman mentioned the fact that the Butcher Shop used a great deal of water and thought a rate should be made to charge them, the matter was referred to the water committee. Rothenburg night watch wished an Ordinance passed to cover the act of any person assaulting an officer who was making an arrest, moved, seconded and carried that City Attorney draw an Ordinance covering the matter.

Bids for the purchase of the Seven thousand five hundred dollar issue of Bonds were received and were as follows: Bid from H. B. Evans for all or any part of the issue; A Bid from George Zimmer for nine five hundred dollar bonds of the issue, at the sum of \$4342.50. Upon motion duly made seconded and carried George Zimmer was awarded and sold nine of the bonds for the sum of \$4342.50, and H. B. Evans was awarded and sold six of the bonds at the price of Four hundred and eighty two dollars each. Whereupon the City Attorney was instructed to get the opinion of Bond Attorneys on the legality of the Bonds.

The Council then proceeded to canvass the election returns on the \$5500.00 bond issue, which election was held on the seventh day of June, 1920, and found that the said bond issue had been carried by the following vote, to wit: For issue 23 votes, against issue 19 votes.

Whereupon the following declaration was made by the Recorder, to wit:

In the presence of Adam Knight, Mayor of Canby, in Clackamas County, State of Oregon, and of the Council of Canby, I, Chas. N. Wait, Recorder of Canby, canvassed the votes cast at the special City election held in the City of Canby, Clackamas County, Oregon, on the seventh day of June 1920, on an act entitled: A Bill for an act; That the following proposed amendment to the Charter of Canby be and the same hereby is proposed for submission to the legal voters of Canby, at a special election to be held on the seventh day of June, 1920, which said amendment is as follows, to wit: An Ordinance to provide for the issuance and sale of bonds of the City of Canby in the sum of five thousand five



hundred dollars, for the purpose of paying the indebtedness heretofore incurred by the City of Canby, and declaring an emergency.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF CANBY:

CANBY DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Sec. 1. The City Council is hereby authorized and empowered to issue and sell interest bearing negotiable coupon bonds of Canby to the amount of Five thousand, five hundred dollars, in addition to the present outstanding bonds, or as much thereof as may be necessary, for the purpose of refunding the indebtedness incurred in constructing the water system of the City of Canby, being the costs and judgment incurred in the case of Hornig vs Canby, The bonds hereby authorized shall be designated as "Bond issue 1920, Series 2" and shall be issued in denominations as may be hereafter provided by the Council of Canby, and shall bear interest not exceeding six per cent, and at a rate to be determined by the Council, payable semi annually, and shall be numbered from one inclusive upwards, and shall be redeemable serially in numerical order, in from one to twelve years or as nearly as may be according to the following schedule, to wit:

The first bonds shall be redeemed two years from the date thereof, at which time \$500.00 of of such bond issue shall be redeemed, and a like sum at such date each year thereafter until the whole of said bond issue has been retired. The bonds issued under this act shall be paid on maturity dates specified heretofore, provided; that Canby reserves the right to pay, take up and cancel any of said bonds prior to maturity upon payment of face value thereof with accrued interest to date of payment, at any semi annual interest paying period at or after two years from the date of any bond, but that said bonds shall be taken up in or der in which they bear number.

Notice stating that certain bonds are to be taken up and cancelled shall be published in a newspaper printed and of general circulation in Canby not less than twice preceeding the semi annual interest paying date, and after said date the interest upon said bonds so designated shall cease.

The Council of Canby is hereby directed to make and there shall be included in the general annual tax levy, annually hereafter, a tax on all the taxable property in Canby, that will provide the sum of \$500.00, and the further sum of which is required to be paid as interest on the outstanding bonds of this issue for such year, until the whole of the foregoing issue including principal and interest, has been fully paid, and the proceeds of such taxes shall be used to pay the interest due on all bonds issued pursuant to this act, and to create a fund to pay the principal of said bonds. That said levy shall be in addition to any other



levy made under the provisions of the Charter of Canby, and that all of the funds derived therefrom shall be kept and placed by the Treasurer of Canby in a separate fund to be known as "Refunding Bond Fund, 1920, Series 2". That said Bonds shall be issued as may be directed by the Council of Canby by Resolution to be adopted hereafter,

Inasmuch as this Ordinance is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety of the people of the City of Canby, because it is necessary that said city shall control and operate the water works of the City and provide water for fire protection and domestic use, and that the obligations of Canby be met, an emergency is hereby declared, and this Ordinance shall go in force and effect from and after its approval by the Mayor.

Which said act appeared on the official ballot at said election and was designated by the following ballot title:

- (1) Referred to the people of Canby by the Council of Canby.
- (2) Amendment to the Charter providing for bond issue for Canby, Clackamas County, Oregon.
- (3) Purpose Shall Canby issue bonds in amount not to exceed Five thousand five hundred dollars, which shall draw interest at a rate not to exceed six per cent; providing for the annual levy to pay the interest and principal. The money derived from such bond issue to be used for the purpose of paying a judgment and costs against the City of Canby.

I find that the votes cast thereon at said special election are as follows, to wit:

I, Adam Knight, Mayor of Canby, in Clackamas County, State of Oregon, do hereby proclaim and declare that an act entitled, "A Bill for an Act That, the following proposed amendment to the Charter of Canby be and the same hereby is proposed for submission to the legal voters of Canby at a special election to be held on the seventh day of June, 1920, which said amendment is as follows to wit: An Ordinance to provide for the issuance and sale of bonds of the City of Canby in the sum of Five thousand five hundred dollars, for the purpose of paying the indebtedness heretofore incurred by the City of Canby, and declaring an emergency.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF CANBY:



## CANBY DOES OBTAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Sec I. The City Council is hereby authorized and empowered to issue and sell interest bearing negotiable bonds coupon bonds of Canby to the amount of Five thousand five hundred Dollars, in addition to the present outstanding bonds, or as much thereof as may be necessary, for the purpose of refunding the indebtedness incurred in the construction of the water system of the City of Canby, being the costs and judgment incurred in the case of Hornig vs Canby, The bonds hereby authorized shall be designated as "Bond issue 1920, Series 2" and shall be issued in denominations as may be hereafter provided by the Council of Canby, and shall bear interest not exceeding six per cent, and at a rate to be determined by the Council, payable ~~semi~~<sup>an</sup> annually, and shall be numbered from one upwards inclusive, and shall be redeemable serially in numerical order, in from one to twelve years or as nearly as may be according to the following schedule, to wit:

The first bonds shall be redeemed two years from the date thereof, at which time \$500.00 of such bond issue shall be redeemed, and a like sum at such date each year thereafter until the whole of said bond issue has been retired. The bonds issued under this act shall be paid on maturity dates specified heretofore, provided; that Canby reserves the right to pay, take up and cancel any of said bonds prior to maturity upon payment of face value thereof with accrued interest to date of payment, at any semi annual interest bearing or paying period or after two years from the date of any bond, but that said bonds shall be taken up in order in which they bear number.

Notice stating that certain bonds are to be taken up and cancelled shall be published in a newspaper printed and of general circulation in Canby not less than twice preceeding the semi annual interest paying date, and after said date the interest upon said bonds so designated shall cease.

The Council of Canby is hereby directed to make, and there shall be included in the general annual tax levy, annually hereafter, a tax on all the taxable property in Canby, that will provide the sum of \$500.00 and the further sum of which is required to be paid as interest on the outstanding bonds of this issue for such year, until the whole of the foregoing issue including principal and interest, has been fully paid and the proceeds of such taxes shall be used to pay the interest due on all bonds issued pursuant to this act, and to create a fund to pay the principal of said bonds. - (2) Amendment to the Charter providing for bond issue for Canby, Clackamas County, Oregon.
- (3) Purpose, shall Canby issue bonds in amount not to exceed Five thousand five hundred Dollars, which shall draw interest at a rate not to exceed six per cent; providing for the annual levy to pay the interest and principal. The money derived from such bond issue to be ~~paid~~ used for the purpose of paying a judgment and costs against the City of Canby. Was adopted, approved, passed and carried by the legal voters of Canby.

That at said special election the total number of votes cast were 42; that of said total number of votes so cast there were cast for said act 23 votes; against said act 19 votes; that the majority of said votes cast at said election for said act were four(4) votes.

I therefore proclaim, and declare said act adopted, approved, passed and carried by the legal voters of Canby and that said act is now a part of the Charter and fundamental law of Canby.

WHEREAS, thereafter the Council duly considered said remonstrances and have heretofore found that same were not legally signed by the owners of two thirds of the property abutting upon said Street or the part thereof proposed to be improved; and

WHEREAS, the Council have acquired jurisdiction to order the proposed improvement to be made; now therefore,

CANBY DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:



Section 1. That E Street from the center line of First Street south <sup>easterly</sup> to the ~~west~~ line of paving on Second Street in the City of Canby, Oregon, be improved by grading, draining, shouldering and paving same with hard surface pavement 16 feet wide and by doing such other work as will be necessary to make a full and complete improvement. Said improvement to be made in accordance with the plans and specifications by the City Surveyor heretofore adopted ~~therefor~~.

Section 2. Inasmuch as there is urgent need of the aforesaid improvement to be made at as early a date as possible during the dry season an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this ordinance shall go into force and effect upon its adoption and approval.

Read the first time and ordered posted the 9th day of June, 1920. Date of posting June, 10th 1920.

Upon motion duly made, seconded and carried all these ordinances were ordered posted as the cost of publishing was considered excessive by the Council.

#### RESOLUTION OF INTENTION.

WHEREAS, the Council of the City of Canby deems it expedient and necessary to improve

On the west side of "C" Street from the south line of First Street to the east line of Poplar Street, and on the east side of Poplar Street from the west line of "C" Street to the easterly line of Yee's addition

WHEREAS, the City Surveyor has heretofore filed such plans, specifications and estimates in the office of the Recorder; and

WHEREAS, the Council has examined and found such plans, specifications and estimates to be satisfactory; now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF CANBY That it is hereby declared to be its intention to improve
