

Regular Meeting of the Council.

Canby, Oregon, September, 13th 1920.

Council called to order at 8 O'clock P.M. by Mayor A.H. Knight.

Present Mayor Knight, Recorder C.N. Wait, Marshall C.E. Bowman City Attorney P.L. Hammond, and Councilmen Combs, Dedman, Evans, Sandsness, White and Slyter. Minutes of previous meeting read and approved as read. A report was made by the City Attorney that the City should have a record of bond issues, and that the same is kept by the City Treasurer, and that the cost of said Record would be about \$25. Moved, seconded and carried that the Treasurer should provide the necessary record book. The following claims against the City were then presented, read and upon motion duly made, seconded and carried were ordered paid and warrants ordered drawn for the same on the motion these voting yes were Councilmen Combs, Dedman, Evans, Sandsness, White and Slyter, Six; Voting No None.

Simonson for Concrete \$42896.14 and there were some conditions attached to the bids by the bidders. Moved, seconded and carried that the bids be referred to the Committee on Streets and Public property to examine and report to the Council at an adjourned meeting to be held Monday evening October 11th 1920. Moved seconded and carried that the Finance Committee prepare a budget for the year 1921. and present the same to the Council Monday night the 11th of October. Upon motion the Council adjourned to meet Monday evening October 11th, 1920.
