

SPECIAL MEETING OF COUNCIL September 8th 1919.

Canby, Oregon, September 8th 1919, Council called to order in an adjourned session from September 2nd 1919, by John Eid president of the Council. There were present John Eid president of the Council, C.N. Wait Recorder and C.E. Bowman Marshall, and Councilmen Evans, Combs, Bowlsby and Sandsness. Mr Robinson City Engineer was called on to explain to the Council the plans and costs of the proposed improvement of streets in Canby. Mr Ben C. Day legal representative of the S.P.R'y Co, made a statement as to the position the Railway Co, took on the matter of street improvements, he said the Co was willing to go to a limited extent only. Thought that it was not necessary at the present time to improve all of First street as proposed, thought it should be improved only in front of Blocks Two and Three. Would insist that the width of pavement on First street be held down to not more than sixteen feet. Agreed that a street crossing over the Railroad was necessary on A street thought no other crossing was necessary, but would talk to the engineering department in regard to a crossing on E street. Does not object to any kind of good pavement. There being nothing further Council then adjourn.
