Council called to order at 8 O'clock P.M. by the Mayor.

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Mr. Slyter reported from the water committee as to the action and doings of the water committee since the fire in regard to the securing of a water supply for the present use of the City, and stated that from all he could learn it would be necessary to get a double Jack and also stated that it was the opinion of the water committee that any new building that might be erected for the housing of the water plant should be of fireproof construction.

Reported that a man would be up in a day or two to examine and report on the condition of the engine and as to what repairs and overhauling would have to be done so as to use it. But that from present indications the engine can be quickly and easily be put in shape to use. Mr. Slyter also talked on present water rates and thought that they should be readjusted. Mr. Evans gave figures as to the outstanding water warrants, and also as to the amounts received for water service since the water system was inaugurated. Mr. Slyter wished the opinion of the Council in regard to the installing of the new machinery purchased, he thought one of the wells should be thoroughly tested before improvements should be made permanently. Complaint was made as to Mr. A. Steffani occupying too much of the street down near his planing mill. Mr. M. J. Lee made an offer of \$15. for an engine that the City owns. Moved by Mr. Evans that the Council endorse the action taken by the water committee in procuring the machinery they have, and that Mr. Slyter be appointed by the Council to oversee and superintend the installing of the same, Carried. Mr. M. J. Lee made application for the insurance on the water plant and building when they are ready to be insured. Considerable talk was then had as to defective sidewalks and crosswalks throughout the town.

The Budget as for the year 19<sup>20</sup>10, as proposed by the Council at its meeting of October 13th 1919 was then brought before the Council and after motion duly made and seconded was put to vote and was carried as proposed, those voting Aye were Councilmen Bewlsby, Evans, Sandsness, Redman, White and Slyter, six voting No None.

Before which the notice of a call for a Budget meeting was filed and the following affidavit of publication of notice was attached thereto, to wit:

#### AFFIDAVIT OF PUBLICATION.

STATE OF OREGON, COUNTY OF CLACKAMAS SS.

I, E. E. Hassler, being first duly sworn, depose and say, that I am the principle clerk of the printer and publisher of THE CLACKAMAS COUNTY NEWS., a weekly newspaper of general circulation, printed and published in Canby, in the aforesaid County and State; that said newspaper is made up of at least four pages of five columns of at



seventeen and three quarters inches in depth or if of smaller pages then comprising an equivalent amount of type matter; that such newspaper was regularly and uninterruptedly published for at least one year immediately preceeding the first publication of the attached notice, and has 200, bona fide subscribers within the County in which it is published; that the attached notice was published in the regular and entire issue of said newspaper for three successive and consecutive weeks, commencing with the issue dated the 16th day of October 1919, and ending with the issue of the 30th day of October 1919. That the price actually charged for this notice was \$12.

The following Ordinance was then read for the third time and upon motion duly made and seconded was put upon its final passage and upon roll call was passed, those voting Aye were Councilmen;

Bowlby Evans, Sandsness, Redman White and Slyter, six, voting No. None.

#### ORDINANCE NO.

An Ordinance for the purpose of levying a tax of Three Thousand dollars on all the taxable property, both real and personal within the City of Canby.

CANBY DOES ORIGIN AS FOLLOWS.

#### Section I.

That the City of Canby doer hereby levy a tax upon all the taxable property, both real and personal which is taxable for State and County purposes within the Corporate limits of Canby to be collected as other taxes are in the State of Oregon by the treasurer and tax collector of Clackamas County Oregon during the year 1920, with the taxes commonly known as the taxes of 1919.

It was moved seconded and carried that said Ordinance be posted for the reason that the charges of publication thereof are in the judgment of the Council excessive, and that publication be dispensed with, and that the same shall be posted in three public and conspicuous places for a period of two full callendar weeks, and to come up for final passage at a regular meeting of the Council of Canby, to be held on the 3rd day of November 1919.
