

Canby, Oregon, December 1st 1919.

Regular meeting of City Council.

Council met and called to order at 8 o'clock P.M. by Mayor A.H.

Knight; present Mayor Knight, Recorder C.W. Vait and Marshall C.E. Bowman and Councilmen Combs, Readman, Eid, Evans Sandness, Slyter and White. Minutes

of previous meeting read and approved as read. Communication of Aug Rethenberg offering \$175.00 for city lot read and placed on file.

Letter of Hammond and Hammond Attorneys read in regard to premium of \$97.50 for appeal bond in the case of Vernig vs Canby and Recorder was instructed to include it along with the other claims to come before the Council. The City Marshall reported that there were many inquiries in regard to the purchase of the gasoline engine belonging to the City which was not now in use. The matter was turned over to Mr Slyter of the water committee to attend to or to sell if he could get \$125.00 for it. Moved that the bills of Fairbanks Morse and Co and the other bills for machinery and supplies purchased for the water plant at this time be referred to Councilman Slyter of the water committee to examine and report on.

The following bills against the City were then read and upon motion duly made seconded and carried by a unanimous vote ordered paid and warrants ordered drawn for the same.

Councilman Slyter then told the Council what had been accomplished in the way of work and material secured for the reconstruction of the water works, he also said he wished to know the ideas of the Council in regard to getting steel girders and putting on a fire proof roof to the engine house, thought the cost would be about one hundred and sixty dollars. Moved, seconded and carried that Councilman Slyter be authorized by the Council to secure girders and columns for the roof the vote being unanimous. Councilman Eid from the committee on finance reported that he had sold the Moving picture booth for thirty dollars, the action of Mr Eid was confirmed by the Council. Mr Evans from committee on revision of water rates reported at length, he stated that it would be necessary to raise an income of \$4378.00, which would practically mean doubling the present rates. Whereupon an Ordinance regulating the water rates was introduced and upon motion read for the first time and was ordered posted and to come up for its final passage at a special meeting of the Council, December 22nd 1919, whereupon Council adjourned.

 Council decided to adjourn until December 29th at 8 O'clock P.M.
 when they would meet and discuss and prepare a new ordinance in
 regard to the water question, motion to adjourn until December 29th
 made and carried. Council then adjourned.
