

Canby, Oregon December 29 1919

Adjourned meeting of the City Council.

Council met and called to order at 8 o'clock P.M. by Mayor A.H. Knight
 Present Mayor Knight, Recorder C.N. Wait Marshall C.B. Bowman and
 Councilmen Bowlsby, Did. Evans, Rodman, Slyter and White. After some dis-
 cussion an Ordinance was introduced, ordered read by the Recorder as
 follows:

ORDINANCE NO 145

An Ordinance to amend Ordinance No 133, of the City of Canby, being
 entitled "An Ordinance adopting rules and regulations for the water
 works of Canby, providing rates for the consumers of water, making it
 unlawful to interfere with water mains, pipes, etc., providing penalty
 therefor, and declaring an emergency, by which the same becomes imme-
 diately operative, by changing rule 15 of section one thereof, and de-
 claring an emergency by which the same may become immediately
 operative.

CANBY DOES OBTAIN AS FOLLOWS.

Section I. Rule 15 of section I, of Ordinance No 133, of the City
 of Canby, entitled an Ordinance adopting rules and regulations for the
 water works of Canby, providing rates for the consumers of water
 making it unlawful to interfere with the mains, pipes, etc., providing
 penalty therefor, and declaring an emergency, by which the same shall
 become immediately operative, be and the same hereby is repealed and
 amended by substituting of the following rule therefor, The balance
 of said Ordinance to remain in full force and effect as heretofore.

Rule 18 of Section I of said Ordinance shall hereafter read as
 follows:

The monthly rates shall be as follows:

Bakeries	\$1.50
Barber shops, 1 chair, 1 tub 1 toilet each additional chair or tub	\$350 flat
Blacksmith shop, butcher shop or fish market	\$1.50
Family rate each toilet or bath 50c or toilet and bath	\$1.25 minimum .75c
Ice cream stands and fountain	\$2.00
Lawn Fountains 1/4 inch nozzle	\$5.00
Public Schools	\$20.00
Livery Stables Public	\$2.00
" Stables Private	\$2.00
Stereo	\$2.00
Water Stake, per head, per month	.25
Sprinkling regular users season per lot of 50x100 ft (3 months)	\$4.00 each lot.

Sprinkling others than regular users per lot of 50X100 feet 3 months	\$4.00
Minimum rates	\$1.50
Public Toilet in store (each)	.30
R.R. station or stock yards	\$4.00
Garage for wash rack	\$5.00
Steam boilers for power 25 c per horsepower	.25
Heating plants	\$1.00

Section 2. Whereas it is necessary for the immediate preservation of the peace, health and safety of the City of Canby, and the inhabitants thereof, that this ordinance become immediately operative, therefore to preserve the peace, health and safety of the City of Canby, and to provide Canby with water works, this ordinance shall take full force and effect upon being approved by three fourths of the Council and the Mayor of the City of Canby.

Read for the first time at an adjourned meeting of the City Council of the City of Canby December 29th 1919, and ordered postponed for the reason that the charges of publication thereof, are in the judgment of the Council excessive, and said publication is hereby dispensed with, and that this Ordinance is hereby ordered posted in three public and conspicuous places for a period of two full calendar weeks, and to come up for final hearing and passage at a special meeting of the Council to be held on Tuesday the 20th day of January 1920, at the hour of 8 o'clock P.M. in the city hall.

After due motion made, seconded and carried the Council adjourned.
