

## Regular meeting of Council.

Canby Oregon. Jan. 6th. 1919.

The Mayor elect and all of the Councilmen elect, except H. A. Pedman having taken the oath of office and been sworn in the Council was called to order at 8, O'clock P.M. by Mayor A. H. Knight, there were present Mayor A. H. Knight, Recorder C. N. Wait, Chief of Police C. E. Bowman and Councilmen Bowlsby, Combs, Eid, Evans, Sandness, Slyter & White; Minutes of previous meeting read and approved, Recorder and Treasurer given until next regular meeting to have their reports ready, The following bills against the City were then read and upon motion ordered paid.

Those voting aye, were Bowlsby, Combs, Eid, Evans, Sandness, Slyter & White, - Voting no, none, Moved that bill for insurance be laid over for further action by the Council; Report of committee on motor power, Mr. Slyter reports that committee did not think it advisable to buy ten horse power motor, but thought both wells should be put in condition before anything further was done, Mr. Robinson spoke about using the well across the road but it is not the property of the City, upon request the recorder then read the contract and agreed submitted to the committee by Mr. Robinson, The committee strongly recommend that something

be done at once to increase the supply of water. It was moved and carried that report of the council be accepted and committee discharged.

Mr Slyter reported from special committee to see Standard Oil Co about getting oil in quantity, that he had not been able to see the agent yet. An ordinance to pay J.E. Hedges for legal services in case of Hornig vs Canby was placed on its final passage, read for the first time at the regular meeting of the Council Dec. 2nd. 1911, and orderer posted in the Judgement of the Council, the cost of publishing the same was excessive, and attached there to was the following affidavit,

One copy on the bulletin board in the City hall, one copy on the City Hotel Bldg. next to side walk, and one copy in the lobby of the Post Office, said copies were full, true and correct copies of said ordinance as read and ordered posted at the regular meeting of the Council Dec 2nd. 1911. that said copies remained continuously posted more than 14 days.

Those voting yes were, Bowlesby, Combs, Eid, Evans, Sansness, Slyter and White. The ordinance was declared carried: The Council then proceeded to elect a president of the Council. John Eid having received four votes was elected President of the Council: C.E. Bowman was then elected Superintendent of the water department, unanimously.

D.R. Dermick having received four votes was declared elected Supt. of Streets, C.N. Wait was declared elected City Recorder unanimously. C.E. Bowman was then appointed Chief of Police by the Mayor elect, subject to the filling and approval of his office bond, The Mayor then announced the appointment of the standing committees as follows.

Finance... Evans, Eid, Combs.

Streets & Public Property... Bowlesby, Sansness, White.

Fire and Water... Eid, White, Slyter.

Health and Police... Dedman, Slyter, Sansness.

The Mayor then addressed the Council on the duties of the Mayor and Councilmen to the City, It was moved that \$556.00 be transferred from the general fund to the water fund, The Mayor then called the President of the Council, John Eid to the chair while he spoke on the Motion, after which the motion was carried.. The Finance Committee was instructed to make an examination of the financial condition of the water department and report to the Council, there being nothing further the Council adjourned.
