Canby, OREGON.

Council met in regular session, and called to order by Mayor A.H. Knight, at 8 o'clock P.M. on April 7th 1912.

Present: Mayor Knight. Recorder C.N. Wait, Chief of Police C.E. Bowman and Supt of Streets D.R. Demick and Councilmen Bowlby, Combs, Redman, Eld, Evans, Sandsness, Slyter and White. Minutes of previous meeting read and approved. Water Supt reported that they wanted water put in to the house on the old Craser place, moved and carried that the Water Supt have the pipes put in and the connections made. Whereupon the following claims against the city were read and upon motion duly carried ordered paid, These voting aye were Councilmen, Bowlby, Combs, Redman, Eld, Evans, Sandsness, Slyter and White.

Mr Evans of Finance Committee reported that Treasurers report was checked over and was found correct so far as the committee could see. Upon the Mayors suggestion Mr Evans stated that the committee would probably have a statement at the next Council Meeting, as to the

expense of operating and the earning ability of the City water system. Committee on Carriage dump reported that they had not been able to find any suitable place that they could obtain for that purpose. Committee on Carriage continued.

Mr Olsen a Pump and well expert was present and upon request gave his ideas in regard to the City well, and explained as to his belief what it would be necessesary to do to remedy the trouble. Mr E.C. Robinson then talked to the Council about using electric power for pumping the water for the City, and using an auxilliary well for furnishing water for City purposes. It was then moeved and carried that the matter of fixing the well and pump be left to the water committte with power to go ahead and do what ever was necessary to do.

There being no further business the Council then adjourned.
