Council met in regular session, and called to order by Mayor W.H. Bair, at 8 30, P.M. Present Mayor Bair, Recorder C.N. Wait, Chief of Police C.E. Bowman, Street Supt Wilson Evans, and Councilmen Wang, Eid, Combs, Slyter Dedman Evans and White; Minutes of previous meetings of Sept 3rd, and Sept 30th, read and approved as read. Moved and seconded to transfer the sum of \$550.00 from the General Fund to the water fund, as that was the amount of tax collected for the Water Fund under the budget passed in 1917, carried unanimously.

Moved that the matter of preparing a budget for the year 1919 be taken up, carried. Whereupon the following budget for the year 1919 was proposed by the Council, to be put before the voters of Canby, at a budget meeting to be held Monday evening November 4th 1918, at 8 o'clock P.M. at the City Hall in Canby.

Ordered that the proposed budget be published for three successive publications in the weekly Clackamas County News.

On the question of appointment of judges and clerks for the regular City Election on November 5th 1918, the Recorder was instructed to see or write to the District Attorney, for information in regard to the

necessesary steps to be taken under the new law.

Recorder instructed to get ballots and make all necessesary arrangements for the special election.

The following Budget for Canby, for the year 1919. was adopted by the Council at the regular meeting of the Council on Oct 7th 1918. and order published.

Canby, Oregon, October 31th 1918.

Council met in City Hall at 8 30, P.M. with the voters of Canby to consider the proposed budget for 1919 as per the notice published in the Clackamas County News for three successive publications. There were present, Mayor W.H. Bair, Recorder C.W. Wait, Chief of Police C.E. Bowman, and Councilmen John Eid, C.C. Combs, H.B. Evans, C.W. White and Ora Slyter, and a number of legal voters of Canby. The Mayor explained to the voters present the purpose of the meeting, and instructed the Recorder to read aloud the proposed budget, after which the Mayor said the budget would be read item by item, and if there was any one present that wished to ask any questions, or move for any change in the budget it was their privilege to do so, and that the matter would be brought before the meeting for action. The entire budget was then read section by section to the assembled voters, and there being no objection raised to any part thereof the proposed budget as published was declared by the Mayor as adopted by the meeting, and to come up for adoption by the Council at its next regular meeting, November 4th 1918. There being no further business the Council and budget meeting adjourned.
