Special Meeting of City Council

Canby, Oregon November 1 1918

Council met in special session to canvass the vote cast at the special election held on October 30th 1918, in regard to amending the charter of Canby, under the Ordinance passed on August 20th 1918: Called to order by Mayor W.H. Bair at 8 O Clock P.M. Present Mayor W.H. Bair, Recorder C.N. Wait, Chief of Police C.E. Bowman, and Councilmen L.H. Wang, C.C. Combs, John Eid, C.W. White, H.B. Evans and Ora Slyter.

Before canvassing the vote, the following affidavits were filed and read by the Recorder.

I, C.N. Wait being first duly sworn depose and say, that I am a white male citizen of the United States and a resident of the City of Canby, County of Clackamas, State of Oregon, over the age of twenty one years.

That on the 8th day of October 1918, I posted true and correct copies of the annexed notice in six public places within the corporate limits of the City of Canby, Clackamas County, Oregon, to wit: One in the fire engine room of the City Hall, one on front street on City Hotel building, one in the lobby of the Post Office, one on front street at the intersection of A street, one on Blacksmith shop W.E. cor of 3rd and C street and one on B street where it turns to go to the Willamette River. That said notices were posted more than ten days prior to October 30th 1918. And were posted by me C.N. Wait Recorder of Canby.

That at the request of C.N. Wait, Recorder of the City of Canby, I distributed to every voter in the City of Canby, as far as possible, a pamphlet containing the measures to be voted on at the special City election to be held on Wednesday October 30th 1918, The printing of which pamphlet was ordered by the City Council at the Council meeting of September 30th 1918,

That all of said pamphlets were so delivered by me more than eight days before the election at which the measures were voted on, to wit: more than eight days before the 30th day of October 1918, That I made all of said deliveries of said pamphlet on the 18th day of October 1918.

After the reading of the foregoing affidavits the Council proceeded to canvass the vote polled on said Charter amendments on said October 30th 1918. After which the Recorder made the following report to the Council, to wit:

In the presence of W.H. Bair, Mayor of Canby, in Clackamas County State of Oregon, and of the council of said City, I, C.W. Wait, recorder of the city of Canby, canvassed the votes cast at the special city election held in said city on the 30th day of October 1918, on an act entitled:

"A Bill for an act entitled an act to amend Chapter II and III of the Charter of Canby, in Clackamas County, Oregon entitled A Bill for an act entitled an act to incorporate Canby, in Clackamas County, State of Oregon; fixing the boundaries thereof; providing for the election and appointment of its officers, defining their qualifications, their duties, their powers and fixing their terms of office; providing for the organizing of the city council, the manner of the passage of ordinances, the establishment or alteration of the grade of any street or alley, and for the improvement thereof, the building and repair of any sidewalks, the laying out and establishing of sewer districts and the construction of sewers and drains therein the levying and collecting of assessments and reassessments for the cost of improvement of streets and alleys and the construction of sewers and drains; providing for a docket of city liens, for the sale and redemption of property on account of delinquent assessments, for the condemnation of property for public use, for the issuance of bonds, for the owning, building and maintaining of water works for the said city; for the raising and expenditure of public money; for the liability of Canby; validating the past acts of Canby; fixing the terms of office of the present officials and repealing all acts and parts of acts in conflict herewith."

Which said act appeared on the ballot at said election and was designated by the following ballot title:

1. Referred to the people of Canby, by the Council of Canby;
2. Chapters II and III of the Charter for Canby, Clackamas County Oregon.
3. Purpose; Shall Canby amend Chapters II and III of the Charter of Canby, to conform to the present constitution of the State of Oregon, so as to have a general biennial election and providing for the election and appointment of its officers, as

#### PROCLAMATION.

I, W. H. Bair Mayor of Canby, in Clackamas County, State of Oregon, do hereby proclaim and declare that an act entitled;

"A Bill for an act entitled an act to amend Chapters II and III of the Charter of Canby, in Clackamas County, Oregon, entitled, a bill for an act entitled an act to incorporate Canby, in Clackamas County, State of Oregon; fixing the boundaries thereof; providing for the election and appointment of its officers, defining their qualifications, their duties, their powers and fixing their terms of office providing for the organization of the City Council, the manner of the passage of ordinances, the establishment or alteration of the grade of any street or alley and for the improvement thereof, the building and repair of sidewalks, the laying out and establishing of sewer districts and the construction of sewers and drains therein, the levying and collecting of assessments and the re-assessing for the cost of improvement of streets and alleys and the construction of sewers and drains; providing for a docket of City liens, for the sale and redemption of property on account of delinquent assessments, for the condemnation of property for public use, for the issuance of bonds, for the owning, building and maintaining of water works for the said City; for the raising and expenditure of public money; for the liability of Canby; validating the past acts of Canby; fixing the terms of office of the present officials, and repealing all acts and parts of acts in conflict herewith; which was submitted to a vote of the legal voters of the City of

Canby, in Clackamas County, State of Oregon, for their adoption or rejection at a special city election held in said City on the 30th day of October 1918, which said act appeared upon the official ballot at said special city election, and was designated by the following ballot title:

1 Referred to the people of the City of Canby by the Council of Canby:

2 Chapter II and III of the Charter for Canby, Clackamas County, Oregon:

3 Purpose: Shall Canby amend Chapters II and III of the Charter of Canby to conform to the present constitution of the State of Oregon, so as to have a general biennial election, and providing for the election and appointment of its officers, as proposed by said Council:

was adopted, approved, passed and carried by the legal voters of Canby.

That at said special election the total number of votes cast were 25; that of said total number of votes so cast, there were cast for said act 25 votes; against said act none votes; that the majority of the said votes cast for said act at said election were 25 votes; that there were no defective ballots.

I therefore proclaim and declare said act was adopted, approved passed and carried by the legal voters of Canby and that the said act is now a part of the Charter and fundamental law of Canby.

Done at the Council Chambers of Canby in Clackamas County State of Oregon, this 1st day of November A.D. 1918.
