Regular Meeting of the Council.

Council met and called to order by Canby, Oregon, November 4 1918  
W.H. Bair, Mayor, at 8 o'clock P.M. Present Mayor W.H. Bair, Recorder C.  
N. Wait, Chief of Police C.E. Bowman, and Councilmen L.H. Wang, C.C. Combs  
H.B. Evans, John Eid, C.W. White and Ora Slyter.  
Minutes of previous meetings of October 31st and November 1st

read and approved. Communication of M.J. Lee in regard to bill of  
\$34.90, for printing Ordinances about a year ago referred to finance  
committee and Recorder was instructed to draw a warrant for the  
payment of the same if the finance committee should report favorably  
Mr Lee having agreed to cancel any claim he might have against the  
city for work on the well or pump if the printing bill was paid.

Petition received from citizens in regard to the placing of a street  
light in the South East part of town read and on motion referred to  
the committee on streets and public property with power to act in  
the matter. The Mayor reported that he had talked with Mr Launer in  
regard to settling for the injury sustained by his wife from falling  
on a defective sidewalk within the city limits and that Mr Launer  
agreed to accept \$150.00, as payment in full for all injuries that  
were sustained by Mrs Launer, the said sum to be paid in two month  
ly payments of seventy five dollars each. Thereupon it was moved  
seconded and carried that the Recorder draw a warrant in each  
November and December for the sum of \$75.00 in favor of Mr Launer  
to pay said claim, the vote on said motion was unanimous.

A bill for legal services in the sum of \$150.00. was presented by J.  
L. Hedges for legal services rendered in the case of Hornig vs Canby  
and the Recorder was instructed to prepare an Ordinance to that  
effect to present at the next Council meeting.

A motion was made, seconded and carried that the Recorder draw a  
warrant on the water fund for the sum of \$100.00. to pay the interest  
on the bond issue of \$6500.00, the vote on the motion was unanimous  
It was moved seconded and carried that the budget as proposed by the

Council on Oct 2th 1918, and ratified by the Citizens meeting of  
October 30th, be declared passed and adopted by the Council carried  
Mr Bowman asked that his wages as Chief of Police be raised, and  
the Council upon motion by Councilman Wang raised the salary of the  
Chief of Police to \$45.00 per month.
