On roll call the following Councilmen voted Aye on the payment of bills as read: Wang, Eid, Combs, Evans and Headman, carried. Recorder reported that the supply of blank City warrants was about gone. Recorder instructed to have some printed if necessary in the matter of street lights, at Lee and Fenton streets and also at the Elroy Bates corner, committee recommended that matter rest until

later in the season. Committee on Garbage dump not ready to report and it was agreed that the Committee and Mayor go and inspect the proposed grounds on Tuesday Eve, June 4th. The Mayor who was on a committee to interview the Standard Oil Co, in regard to chances to obtain oil in large quantities if needed, reported that he had interviewed the manager of that company while in Portland and that he was informed that there was no apparent danger of the supply for the City of Canby being shut off but that if it should occur, the City had better use distillate or Kerosene, but that the idea of buying in quantity and storing was impracticable on account of the cost of barrels and the other difficulties of storing and keeping it. The Recorder was instructed to write to the State Public Service Co. in regard to getting Train No. 13, to stop at Canby. Instructed to notify the City Treasurer to have a complete Financial report of the several City Funds ready for the Council by July 1st. There being no further business the Council adjourn

at 7:30 PM July 12/9/18.
