

## REGULAR MEETING OF THE CITY COUNCIL

Canby, Oregon, November 5th 1917.

A regular meeting of the City Council was called to order by the Mayor, W. H. Bair, at 8 o'clock P. M.

On roll call the following were present: Mayor Bair, Recorder J. Lee Eckerson, Marshall E. C. Bowman, Councilmen Dedman, Wang, Combs, White, and Evans.

Moved by Councilman Wang, seconded by Councilman White that J. Lee Eckerson be appointed as acting Recorder for this meeting and until the next regular meeting in December. Motion carried.

Minutes of the meeting held October 1st and 15th read and approved.

Moved by Councilman Wang, seconded by Councilman Evans that Recorder be authorized to purchase four RR crossing signs from Coast Culvert & Flume Co. Motion carried.

Moved by Councilman Combs, seconded by Councilman Wang that the City assist in improving the Knight hill road and at a cost of not more than \$100.00 to the City, it being understood that an amount equal to the amount contributed by the City be contributed by the citizens of Barlow bottom. Motion carried.

Moved by Councilman Wang, seconded by Councilman White that the Committee on Streets and Public property be instructed to repair the road running from Hampton's corner to the City limits North of town. Motion carried.

Moved by Councilman Evans, seconded by Councilman Combs that the City contribute the sum of Seven & 50/100 dollars per month, beginning November 1st 1917, toward the compensation of the ferryman, E. R. Killgallen, for operating a free ferry on the Willamette River North of Canby. Motion carried.

Moved by Councilman Wang, seconded by Councilman White that the bills be allowed and warrants drawn in payment of the same. Motion carried.

Roll call: Ayes: Wang, Combs, White, Bedman and Evans. ~~Nones~~: Noes; None.

The Recorder read an ordinance entitled, "An ordinance providing for the compensation of the Chief of Police of the city of Canby." and repealing all ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith.

Read for the first time, October 1st 1917 and ordered published according to law, and to come up for final passage at a regular meeting of the Council to be held on Nov. 5th 1917.

Attached to the ordinance was the following affidavit:

I, Edward Satter, being first duly sworn, say that I am the foreman of the Clackamas County News; that said Clackamas County News is a weekly newspaper published and issued weekly and regularly at Canby, in Clackamas County, State of Oregon, and has a general circulation in said county and state; that said newspaper is made up of at least four pages of six columns each and the type matter of a depth of at least 17 $\frac{1}{2}$  inches, and that said newspaper has atleast 200 bona fide subscribers living within the county in which said newspaper is published; that the notice of which the one attached hereto is a true and correct copy was published in said paper once a week for 2 weeks, being published 2 times on dates as follows, towit Oct. 19, and Oct 26, 1917. That said notice was published in the regular and entire issue of every number of said paper, during said period and time of publication, and that said notice was published in the newspaper proper and not in any supplement; that said newspaper has been established and regularly and uninterruptedly published in such county for at least one week during the period of at least 12 consecutive months immediately

proceeding the first publication of this notice.

Motion by Combs, seconded by Evans that said ordinance be placed upon its final passage. Motion carried.

Roll call: Ayes: Wang, Combs, White, Dedman and Evans.

Noes: None.

The budget as presented to the Council on October 15th was read.

No tax-payers objecting thereto, a motion was made and seconded that said budget be adopted as read. Motion carried.

The Recorder then read the following ordinance:

"ORDINANCE NO. 140"

"An ordinance for the purpose of levying a tax of Two thousand seven hundred forty two dollars (\$2,742.00) on all the taxable property, both real and personal within the City of Canby, and declaring an emergency.

CANBY DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That the City Council of Canby does hereby levy a tax of Two thousand seven hundred forty two dollars (\$2,742.00), on all taxable property, both real and personal which is taxable for State and County purposes within the Corporate limits of Canby, to be collected as other taxes are collected in the State of Oregon, by the Treasurer and Tax Collector of Clackamas County, during the year 1918 with the taxes commonly known as the taxes of 1917.

Section 2. That whereas, it is necessary that said tax levy be made and the record thereof be in the hands of the Assessor of Clackamas County before December 1st 1917, in order that said levy may be made, which said levy is made to protect the peace, health and safety of Canby, an emergency is hereby declared, and this ordinance shall go into full force and effect upon its passage by the Council and approval by the Mayor."



Moved and seconded that said ordinance be placed upon its first reading and that same be published. Motion carried.

This ordinance to come us for final passage at a special meeting to be held Nov. 19th 1917.

The office of Councilman P. O. Stacy was declared vacant.

Nominations were opened for ~~the~~ office of councilman to fill the vacancy. John Eid was nominated. No other nominations were made. Ballot was proceeded with and John Eid receiving all votes cast was declared elected.

The Mayor called a special meeting to be held Nov. 19th 1917.

Meeting adjourned.
