The following report was received from the Finance Committee:

·To the Honorable Mayer and Members of the City Council.

Your Committee has examined Mr. Cobb's report, on the expenditure of the proceeds of bonds-voted for the water system, and find it satisfactory and correct, to the best of our belief.

·His-estimate of \$693.43 as 30% of saving on the distributing system and cost of tank and tower, is apparently correct, and should be allowed. In addition to above, under his contract, Mr. Cobb will be entitled to 10% of the cost of labor on the pump house and the installation of the machinery.

We recommend that a further compensation be allowed him, in connection with the taking up of the Lee System, in an amount to be decided by the Council.

The balance on hand at this date in the Water Fund, that is, the proceeds of sale of bonds, is \$254.12, and in addition there is in the Water Rent account, \$337.02.

We have estimated with the aid of the Engineer, further necessary expenditures as follows:

\$ 965.00 Engine Well 275.00 Pump House 300.00 Installing engine 175.00 Pump 300.00 Fire Hose 850.00 or \$900. (2) Hose carts 190.00 Total \$ 3105.00

This leaves a deficiency approximating \$2500.

and makes and from the information I have obtained from the users of fire hose I can with pleasure recomend the purchase of 1,000 feet of $2\frac{1}{2}$ inch Safety Brand Nill Wax and Gum treated double jacketed fire hose from A. G. Long, Portland, Uregon, for the price of 90¢ per lineal foot delivered F. U. B. Canby, Uregon, couplings attached and fitted to hydrants now installed.

An ordinance to amend an ordinance entitled "An Ordinance Adopting Rules and Regulations for the Water Works for Canby" providing rates for the consumers of water, making it unlawful to interfer with water mains, pipes etc. Providing a penalty therefor and declaring an emergency, by which the same shall become immediately operative. Adopted by the Council at an adjourned meeting, held on the 15th day of January, 1917, and approved by the Mayor on the 15th day of January, 1917.

Read for the first time at a special meeting of the Council, held on the 15th day of Fanuary, 1917, and ordered posted, as, in the judgment of the Council, the cost of publishing the same was excessive, and attached thereto was the following affidavit:

URDINANCE NO. 137

An ordinance fixing the compensation of the Superintendent of Water Works of Canby and defining his duties:

Canby does ordain as follows:

Section 1. Salary of the Superintendent of Water Works shall be Forty-five (\$45.00) Dollars per month.

Section 2. The Superintendent of Water Works shall have general control of the water works system of Canby, under the direction of the Council; and shall perform such duties as may be, from time to time, assigned to him by the finance Committee of the Council, and by the Council of Canby.

Metion made that said Ordinance be placed on its first reading, and that it be posted, as in the judgment of the Council, the cost of publishing the same, is excessive.

To come up for final passage on the 5th day of March,

The Recorder was instructed to prepare such notice and to take such steps as may be necessary to secure the repairing of sidewalk near Brown's Warehouse.
