Whereupon the Recorder read the following ordinance:

# ORDINANCE NO. 138.

An Ordinance appropriating the sum of One Thousand One Hundred and Thirty four and 50/100 (\$1134.50) Dollars, to purchase fire hose, hose carts and accessories and declaring an emergency.

### CANBY DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The sum of One Thousand One Hundred thirty four and 50/100 (\$1134.50) Dollars is hereby appropriated to purchase 1000 feet of fire hose, two hose carts and nozzles therefor, from A. G. Long & Company, Portland, Oregon.

Section 2, That the Mayor and Recorder are hereby directed to purchase said fire hose, carts and accessories with the said sum of One Thousand One Hundred and thirty four and 50/100 (\$1134.50) Dollars.

Section 3, Whereas, the City of Canby is without fire protection and by reason of the want thereof the peace, health and safety of Canby and its inhabitants are in danger, an immediate emergency is hereby declared to exist and this ordinance shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage by the Council and approval by the Mayor.

Motion made and seconded that said reading be considered its first reading and that ordinance be posted, for the reason that in the judgment of the Council, the cost of publishing the same was excessive.

To come up for final passage at a regular meeting to be held on the and day of April, 1917.

Motion made and seconded that the old water tank belonging to the City, be sold to Mr. Kaupisch, for Twenty-five (\$25.00) Dollars.

Carried.

The well committee was ordered to meet at 2 o'clock March 6th.
