The Recorder was instructed to notify P. C. Schaubel to commence work to drill liner pipe in bottom of well, in accordance with the contract.

The following petition was read:

TO THE HON. MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF CANBY, OREGON.

We, the undersigned citizens and taxpayers of Canby would most respectfully recommend to your Honorable Body that the City Council make an appropriation not to exceed the sum of \$500 for the purpose of paying the expenses and doctor bills of Peter Hornig incurred for injuries received by him while operating the engine for the pumping plant in the city water works. This petition is not intended to convey the idea of any legal liability on the part of the City of Canby but believing, as a matter of justice on account of the circumstances of the injury of the said Peter Hornig, that the City of Canby should pay for the expenses incurred on account of said accident.

As a matter of compromise I hereby agree to accept the above sum of \$500 in full satisfaction for all claim that I might have against the City of Canby for the injury incurred while running the engine for the water works, being the injury incurred referred to in the above petition. It being expressly understood that upon the failure of the City Council to make the appropriation, this proposal shall not be considered as the full amount of my claim for damaged.

Which petition was signed by Peter Hornig and by forty six (46) petitioners. The petition was referred to the Finance Committee with instructions to bring in a written report on the same.

The matter of the drilling of the City Well to the depth of One Hundred and Five (105) feet was referred to the Finance Committee with instructions to take immediate action.

The report of the Canby Fire Department was received and is as follows:

REPORT OF CANBY FIRE DEPARTMENT TO CITY COUNCIL,
May 7, 1917.

On March 19th, 1917, a meeting was held in the City Hall for the purpose of organizing a volunteer fire department. At this meeting some thirty-five residents of Canby signed their names as willing to become members. A. H. Knight was elected President, H. A. Berkman, Secretary and E. E. Bradtl, Treasurer.

A committee consisting of W. H. Bair, John Eid, G. F. Bates, M. J. Lee and E. G. Robinson was appointed to draft a constitution and by-laws.

On March 26th a meeting was held at which organization of the Department was completed and the constitution and by-laws now submitted for approval of the Council were adopted. George Bendshadler was elected Chief and Wilson Evans, Assistant Chief.

In addition to these regular meetings drills have been held each Monday evening at which the attendance has been good considering weather conditions. At the five drills held there was an average attendance of fourteen. Six men have applied for membership.
