

## REGULAR MEETING OF CITY COUNCIL

February 7, 1916.

Regular meeting of the City Council of the City of Canby called to order by the Mayor, on Monday the 7th day of February, 1916.

On roll call the following were present; Mayor, W. H. Bair; Recorder, P. L. Hammond; Chief of Police, J. W. <sup>Lester</sup> ~~Loder~~, and Councilmen Wang, White, Stacy, Graham, Dedman, Slyter, Combs and Bates.

Upon motion the recorder was instructed to draw warrants in payment of the same. On roll call, that said bills should be paid, the vote was as follows:

AYES: Wang, White, Stacy, Graham, Dedman, Slyter, Combs and Roland Bates.

NOES: None.

,In regard to the matter of having the street lines at the intersection of Third and G. Streets surveyed and grades given, for sidewalks, for O. W. Sturgis and Ora Slyter, the City Engineer reported that he had no transit; that he was unable to survey said street or give the said grades; that it would cost \$1.50 a day to rent such an instrument. This matter was then referred to Chairman of Committee on Streets and Public Property, H. A. Dedman, with instructions to make necessary arrangements, and that said work should be performed and said instrument rented.

The Recorder reported that the cost of a book

to re-write the ordinances in would be approxiamtely Ten and 00/100 (\$10.00) Dollars, and that it would cost approximately Forty and 00/100 (\$40.00) Dollars to re-write all of the present ordinances. This matter was referred to the Committee on Streets and Public property with instructions to ascertain whether the city should or should not have said ordinances copied.

In regard to the matter of the road through the gravel pit leading West towards Barlow, a report was received, that the ditch on both sides of the road through the cut, was filled with gravel and should be cleaned out.

In regard to the matter of the old well on the John Ingar place, also another old well on lot 12 in the Block of the Methodist Church, and also in regard to a well on lot 3 Block 4, and the condition of certain alleys, was referred to the Committee on Health and Police, with instructions to have said matters attended to, that is the wells filled up and the alleys cleaned.

A report of the Street Commissioner, Adam H. Knight was received informing the City Council that the present City drain on Front Street, which drained the water on to Lee's property would be closed for the reason that Mr. Lee desired to improve said property, that he intended building a dam across the ditch, at his property line, and requested the Council to ascertain some other way of disposing of this water. That AA St. needed to be repaired, also B Street needed to be gravelled and that C St. North from Second St. should be re-dressed. A motion was made and carried that said street commissioner be allowed Fifty and 00/100 (\$50.00) Dollars for said street work.

The recorder was requested to draw new notices in regard to the sidewalks on street abutting on the Astmann and Knight property.

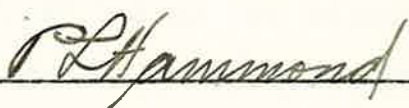


Motion made that the water proposition of M. J. Lee be acted upon by the Council at this time, carried. An ordinance entitled, "An ordinance giving and granting M. J. Lee, his successors and assigns, franchises and rights to erect, maintain, use and remove pipes for the purpose of conveying water in, under, through and over any and all streets, roads, ways and public places of the City of Canby, within the corporate limits thereof; and to engage in the business of furnishing water to the City of Canby and the inhabitants thereof, for a period of thirty five years, this franchise being granted to the said M. J. Lee in lieu of and upon the surrender of all other franchises to engage in the said business owned or controlled by him." was read

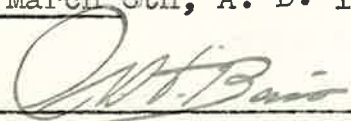
Whereupon, after this matter was discussed, a motion was made that a committee of three be appointed to meet with M. J. Lee to ascertain the price at which the City could purchase the present water system and to report at a council meeting to be called on Monday evening, February 14th. Carried. The Committee appointed,- Stacy, Wang and Dedman.

At the time the matter of the moving picture theatre of the City of Canby, running on Saunday, was brought up. Whereupon a motion was made that the recorder draw an ordinance to repeal the old ordinance in regard to ~~City~~ Pool Hall being open. Said ordinance to come up at the next meeting of the City Council.

On motion meeting adjourned.
