

May 29, 1916.

An adjourned regular meeting of the Council of Canby was called to order by the Mayor, W. H. Bair, on Monday, May 29th, 1916, at eight o'clock P. M.

On roll call the following were present; Mayor W. H. Bair, Councilman Wang, Stacy, Combs, Graham, White, Slyter, and acting recorder, J. Lee Eckerson. Councilmen Dedman and Bates were absent. Immediately after the roll call councilman Dedman came in.

L. H. Wang reported that he had called upon the Lumbermen's Trust Co. regarding the bond issue for the water system of Canby and that the said company had sent Mr. Farrar to this meeting to consult with the council. Mr. Farrar was then introduced and gave some interesting facts in connection with the bond issue.

Councilman Wang moved that the bonds be issued ten to twenty years, optional at six per cent interest payable semi-annually. Said motion was seconded by Councilman Dedman. Carried.

Motion then made by Councilman Slyter and seconded by Wang, that the bonds be of the denomination of Five Hundred and 00/100 (\$500.00) Dollars each. *Motion carried.*

Mr. Cobb was then introduced and was requested to quote his price as engineer for the proposed water system. He agreed to furnish plans and specifications and all things in connection therewith up to and including the awarding of the bids for the sum of Two Hundred and 00/100 (\$200.00) Dollars, and Ten and 00/100 (\$10.00) Dollars per day for actual service of Mr. Cobb after the bids are

awarded and Four and 00/100 (\$4.00) Dollars per day for actual service of an inspector or superintendent.

Councilman Graham made a motion, which was seconded by White that the above proposition of Mr. Cobb be accepted. Motion carried.

On motion duly made and seconded, meeting adjourned.
