

July 3rd, 1916.

Regular meeting of the Council of Canby called to order by the Mayor, W.H. Bair on Monday, July 3rd, 1916, at eight o'clock P.M.

On roll call the following were found to be present: Mayor, W.H. Bair, Recorder, P.L. Hammond, Councilmen Wang, Combs, Graham, Slyter, Dedman, Stacy and Bates.

The minutes of the previous meetings were read and approved.

On roll call, ^{Ayer} Wang, Combs, Graham, Slyter, and Bates. *None*

John Graham reported that the committee to return the chairs belonging to the city hall had requested Wirfel to have these moved from the picture show but he had failed to do so, whereupon a motion was made directing the chief of police to return the chairs. Carried.

Committee for the purchase of a fire bell was requested to make a report. Informed the Council they had not purchased the bell and were ordered to do so at once.

Committee on streets and public property ordered to have the grass on the streets of Canby cut at once.

Recorder then read the following Ordinance:

Ordinance No. _____

An ordinance providing for the purchase of the franchises, water rights, mains, pipe lines, pipes and water business of M.J. Lee in Canby, appropriating \$5000 therefore. Permitting M.J. Lee, his heirs and assigns, to maintain a pipe across the alley of block numbered 16 of Canby.

CANBY DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:-

Sec. 1. Whereas Canby desires to purchase the water rights, franchises, pipes, mains, pipe lines and water business owned by M.J. Lee in Canby. The sum of \$5000 is hereby appropriated for that purpose.

Sec. 2. That the Council of Canby is hereby authorized and empowered to pay the said sum of \$5000 to M.J. Lee upon such conditions as may hereafter be adopted by the Council.

Sec. 3. M.J. Lee, his heirs and assigns are hereby granted a right and privilege to maintain a pipe across

the alley in Block 16 of the city of Canby for a period of thirty years which said pipe shall be maintained or layed in accordance with the provisions of the Ordinances of Canby.

Motion made that the ordinance be referred back to the city attorney to be redrawn so that it be referred to the people.

On motion made and seconded that said reading be considered the first reading of said ordinance, and for the reason that charges for publication thereof were, in the judgment of the Council, excessive, ~~and therefore~~ said publication was dispensed with and the recorder was ordered to post the ordinance in three public and conspicuous places in said city for a period of two calendar weeks. Said ordinance to come up for final passage at a special meeting of the council to be held July 18th, 1916 at eight o'clock. Whereupon the Recorder read the following ordinance.

Ordinance No. _____.

An ordinance appropriating the sum of \$228.00 for the purpose of building or purchasing a ferry boat.

CANBY DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:-

Sec. 1. The sum of \$228.00 is hereby appropriated for the purpose of purchasing or building a ferry boat. Said ferry boat shall be purchased or built in accordance with such plans or specifications as may be adopted by the Council of Canby.

On motion duly made and seconded, said reading was considered the first reading of said ordinance, for the reason that charges for publication thereof were, in the judgment of the council, excessive and ~~therefore~~ said publication was dispensed with and the recorder was ordered to post said ordinance in three public and conspicuous places in

said city for a period of two full calendar weeks. Said ordinance to come up for final passage at a regular meeting of the council to be held on the 7th day of August, 1916, at eight o'clock.

The school board of Canby petitioned for crossings to be built on C street, at what is known as the Bradtl corner.

This matter was referred to the committee on streets and public property, to put in two crossings in such a manner as they saw fit.

Street commissioner, A.H. Knight, requested that he be instructed which of the city's streets should be oiled. This matter was referred to the committee on streets and public property.

Whereupon, the Recorder presented a bill from the Standard Oil Company for \$166.67 for one tank of oil.

Motion made that said bill be allowed.
