The Committee on Fire and Water reported that the old hotel owned by Carlton And Rosenkrans Company on First Street, was a fire trap; that in the shed at the rear was a wagon half filled with papers, that it was reported that there was a large amount of rubbish, papers and rags in a store room on the second floor.

The matter of granting an extension of time to persons without septic tanks, in order that they might comply with the ordinance for that purpose, was referred to the Committee on Health and Police.

A report was turned in on the gutter that has been constructed down First Street on C. Street, that it had cost approximately forty-two (42) cents a running foot.

The Street Commissioner reported that he was attempting to secure a roller for the streets, and as soon as he could get it and could get gravel from New Era, we would commence constructing asphalt bound gravel streets. The Street Commissioner was instructed by the Council to secure a steam roller and proper machine to heat the asphalt and spread it on the street, and his expenses in so doing would be paid by the Council.

The Recorder was instructed to draw warrants on the Treasurer and pay for the gravel as it was shipped into Camby and turn in the receipted freight bills as vouchers.

On motion duly made and seconded, meeting adjourned.
