The street commissioner was instructed to keep First Street clean and in good shape until the gravel had set. And he was further ordered to gravel the street near Brown's warehouse from the Holtzman corner to A. Street.

The Recorder was instructed to secure information from the government in regard to establishing a ferry across the Willamette River, North of Canby.

Motion was made that \$5.00 be appropriated to pay Joe Stefani for a gravel bunker on the Southern Pacific right of way. The motion was carried and on roll call the vote was as follows:

In the matter of appropriating \$5.00 for poor and needy persons who live in Canby, to secure railroad tickets to points outside of the State of Oregon. A motion was made that \$5.00 be appropriated for that purpose and that said money be given to H. H. Gillmore to expend for said persons. Motion carried. On roll call the vote was as follows:

The recorder was instructed to draw a warrant for said sum.
