REGULAR MEETING OF THE CITY COUNCIL

Regular meeting of the city C uncil of the City of Canby called to order September 13th, 1915, by the Mayor, W. H. Bair.

On roll call there were present Mayor, Recorder, Chief of Police and Councilmen Gillmore, Wang, Meeks, Stacy, Graham and Dedman.

The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

The following bills were presented and on motion were ordered paid. On roll call the vote was as follows:

The Recorder was instructed to draw warrants for the payment of the above bills.

At this time the Recorder was instructed to note the arrival of Councilman Grant White.

The recorder was instructed to look up the building ordinance which was before the Council about a year ago and to have the same before the Council at the next regular meeting.

In the matter of the request of Carlton and Rosen-krans Company to have an electric light placed so as to light the horse sheds behind their store, providing that Carlton & Rosenkrans Company would pay the costs of installation and the City to maintain the light, the following resolution was adopted:

*BE IT RESOLVED, that the City of Canby maintain an electric light situate in the horse sheds of Carlton :

And Rosenkrans Company behind their present store.

The Recorder was instructed to notify the electric light company to install said light.

The proposition offered the city by Mr. Warnstaff in regard to policing the city was considered by the council and on motion laid on the table. The following resolution was introduced and adopted:

*BE IT RESOLVED that two policemen be hired by the City of Canby during the four days of the Clackamas County Fair at a salary of Three and 00/100 (\$3.00) Dollars per day. The said deputies to be designated by the chief of police.

River was brought up and the recorder reported that he had secured the necessary blue prints required by the Government in order to obtain a permit to maintain a cable across the river. Adam Knight requested that a man be hired to run the ferry during Fair time and if possible for the next two weeks. That he believed that such a man could be hired at a rate of not less than Thirty and 00/100 (\$30.00)

Dollars per month. The following resolution was introduced and adopted:

"BE IT RESOLVED, what a ferry man be hired by the Mayor of Canby and that his wages be set by the mayor; that said ferry was to be maintained by the City of Canby during the days and evenings while the Fair was in session, and is to be a free ferry."

The following resolution was introduced and adopted, by unanimous vote.

Council of the City of Canby, that the side walk on the east side of E Street, from the main track of the Oregon & California Railroad Company, to the street crossing on the easement of the City of Canby, along the south side of the Oregon & california Railroad Company's right of way through Canby, shall be reconstructed and rebuilt within twenty days from the date of service of this nobice so to do, upon the Oregon & California Railroad Company, owners of the abilting property and said side walk shall be feet wide.

The following resolution was introduced and adopted by unanimous vote.

Motion being made and carried,

That the bouncil adjourn.

Council adjourned.
