December 9, 1915.

Regular meeting of the City Council of the City of Canby called to order, Thursday, Becember 9th, 1915, at eight o'clock P. M. by the Mayor.

Whereupon, the following resolution was introduced:

" BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CANY:

That Whereas, W. H. Bair received 83 votes
for Mayor; J. Lee Eckerson, received 97 votes for
Treasurer; P. O. Stacy received 93 votes for councilman;
Ora Slyter received 95 votes for councilman, and Geo.
F. Bates received 96 votes for councilman and C. G. Combs
received 64 votes for councilman,

That W. H. Bair be and he is hereby declared to have been elected as Mayor of the City of Canby, for the term commencing, January 1st, 1916;

That J. Lee Eckerson be and he is hereby declared to have been elected as Preasurer of the City of Canby for the term commencing January 1st, 1916:

That P. O. Stacy, Ora Slyter, Geo. F. Bates and C. G. Combs be and they are hereby declared to have been elected as Councilmen of the City of Canby for the term commencing January 1st, 1916;

"And that whereas, the ordinance entitled:

"An Ordinance declaring it a nuisance for dogs to run at large in the City of Canby and declaring it a misdemeanor for any person to permit a dog to run at large and prescribing a penalty therefor, and authorizing the police to take up said dogs, to keep and post a notice of taking, and to release or kill the same." received 67 votes for its adoption and 38 votes for its rejection. "

On roll call the vote on the foregoing resolution was as follows:

AYES: Councilmen Gillmore, Wang, Stacy, Graham, Dedman and Meeks.

NOES: None.

The Recorder was instructed to take up the matter of certain unsanitary toilets and send notices out in regard to the same.

The Committee on Streets and Public Property was instructed to re-set the City flag pole.

The report of the Street Commissioner was received and he was instructed to do such work as was necessary on Front and B Streets and on the road to Good's Bridge.

On motion the meeting adjourned.
