

Meeting of the City Council.

Meeting called to order, by the Mayor, The Honorable, councilmen  
W. H. H. Bair, January 4, 1915, on roll call the following/were  
present Gillmore, Wang, White, Meeks, Stacy, Graham, Chief of  
Police, Lieser, Recorder, Hammond.

Minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

Declared carried and the Recorder instructed to draw  
warrants for said bills.

The Council then took up the matter of the account between  
the City of Canby, and M. J. Lee, and the following was decided  
that Councilmen Meeks and the Chief of Police should be a committee  
to take up the bill for Forty Dollars presented and settle the same  
with M. J. Lee, that the City should allow the bills of the Canby  
Water Works for the months of December and January, that M. J. Lee  
should receive the difference between the total amount of those  
bills and \$31.00, which was the amount of the costs of the improve-  
ment of the street in front of Lee's 2nd Addition to Canby and the  
cost of a certain advertisement for an ordinance which M. J. Lee  
agreed to pay, which two bills were for \$16.00 and \$15.00.

Petition received and read that certain lights be placed

on the County Road, in the City of Canby, leading past the Hampton Prune Orchard, so that the citizens in the north end of Canby would have such protection as such lights would afford them.

On Motion, it was ordered that two lights be placed as directed by the Committee on Streets and Public Property on the County Road.

Recorder instructed to notify the Molalla Electric Company and the Committee.

Report of the Recorder's books for the last two quarters of 1914 read.

Motion made and seconded that Stacy, Eckerson and Hammond should audit the Treasurer's and Recorder's books and make then balance.

The Council then proceeded to ballot for Street Commissioner, on the first ballot

Adam Knight recieved 5 votes  
J. W. Lieser " 1, Adam Knight was  
declared elected.

The Council then proceeded to ballot for Surveyor,  
Fred Roth recieved 6 and was declared  
elected, on the first ballot.

The Council then proceeded to ballot for City Attorney  
and on the first ballot?

Hammond recieved 4 votes  
Stacy " 2, Hammond was declared  
elected.

The Council then proceeded to ballot for Chief of Police,  
and on the first ballot,  
J. W. Lieser, recieved 6 votes and was  
declared elected.

The matter of Bonds for the different officers then was  
discussed and the  
discussed and the Recorder was instructed to notify the various  
officers that the Treasurer, would be required to give bond for  
\$3 000.00, the Chief of Police and the Recorder for the sum of  
One Thousand Dollars, each.
