The Recorder further reported to the City Council that Veronika Astmann had informed him that she would repair said sidewalk as soon as she could get lumber, and on inquiry at Stefani's Lumber yard the Recorder found that the lumber had been ordered and would be delivered in the morning, to-wit, March 2nd, 1915, . A motion was then made that this matter be laid on the table.

A communication was received by the Council asking if the Council would sell the lot in Block 8 on which the old City Jail now stands, and if the Council desired to sell if they would consider \$150.00. A motion was made and seconded that the offer should be refused, and that the Recorder communicate to all parties desiring to buy this lot that the City had no intention of selling it. Said motion was carried.

On motion this matter was laid on the table until the next
Council meeting, and the Committee on Streets and Public Property was asked to report as to the feasibility of placing the

It was moved and seconded that the City purchase a new fire bell trading in the old fire bell as a part of the purchase price. And that the new fire bell be hung on two tall poles on First Street, if possible. Carried. This matter was then referred to the Committee on Fire and water with orders to report at the next council meeting.
