## MEETING OF THE CITY COUNCIL

Regular meeting of the CityCouncil was called to order at 8.00 P. M. May 3, 1915, by the Mayor, W. H. Bair.

On roll call the following were present: Mayor,
Recorder, Chief of Police, Councilmen Gilmore, White, Meeks,
Graham and Dedman.

The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

The following communication was read by the Recorder:

"To the Hon. Mayor and Council of Canby, Or. May 3rd 15.

"Sire:

I find that it will be impossible for me to get the change made in the toilets on my place as required by the Council, by the first of June, 1915, and therefore would ask for an extension of time for 3 months and can assue you I will have the required changes made by that time. Awaiting your consideration in the matter, I remain respectfully,

Cassie Evans."

The Recorder was instructed to note the arrival of Councilman Stacy at this time.

Motion made and seconded that the matter contained in the communication of Cassie Evans, be laid on the table;

H. C. Gilmore reported that he had, at the request of Cassie Evans, carefully looked into this matter, and also White,

Meeks, Stacy, Dedman and Mayor Bair reported that they had been requested by Cassie Evans to take this matter up personally and inspect the premises which they had done.

address the Council and declared that he had plenty of water in his tank to supply all consumers this coming summer; that if he caught anyone wasting water he intended to assess them \$1.00, which \$1.00 would go into a fund to be known as the "Fountain Fund."

The motion above referred to in the matter of the communication from Cassie Evans, being left to a vote of the Council was carried, and the request of Cassie Evans was laid on the table until the next meeting.

A communication from W. C. Moore in regard to a water tank was read by the Recorder and he was instructed to place this matter on file.

The Mayor requested a report from the Committee who were to purchase a new fire bell. The Committee reported that they had done nothing whatsoever in this regard. They were instructed by the Mayor to purchase a fire bell twice the size of the present bell and turn in the bell now owned by the City as part payment.

The Recorder reported that Max Telford had failed to pay the taxes for the year 1914, against the property which he had deeded to the City for street purposes, being C. Street immediately south of the Southern Pacific right of way. The Recorder was instructed to take this matter up with Mr. Telford and make some settlement of the same.

The following bills were read and on motion the Recorder was instructed to draw warrants for the same, the vote being as follows:

Adam Knight, street commissioner reported that he had run a preliminary survey and a permanent survey East on First St. from C. St.; that he was having considerable trouble in securing the necessary fall for the concrete gutter, which he had been instructed to build; that he had decided that a fall of one inch in fifty feet was the proper amount of fall for this gutter, and that the street was level, and that such fall would put the gutter too far in the ground on the East end; that the crown of First St. was now above the level of the sidewalk. And that in order to surface this street in a proper manner, he would be forced to cut out several hundred yards of gravel and dirt from the present surface of the street; that the strest at present is level on top, the crown having been worn completely off and he believed that he could resurface the street by putting asslight covering of gravel on the present slope and new crown; that C. St. was altogether too high, that he would be forced to remove a large amount of dirt and gravel from said street; that he was unable to obtain any gravel at New Era; that the men who owned the gravel plant at New Era were at present working at Butteville, and he would be forced to wait until their return before he could commence the street work.

On motion made, the kind of surfacing to be put on C St. and First St. to be eleft to a committee of three. Lost on vote by the Council.

Mr. Knight reported that he had no equipment to resurface the street, and that he would be compelled to borrow from the county; that at present it was impossible to borrow anything whatever from the county; that the county owned five steam rollers and one scarifier, but that these were all in use. He was requested to inform the council what these tools were, as the county court had continuously, for many years, kept them in the North end of the County, to the detriment to the roads around Canby;

stumps in the road at the entrance to the Fair Grounds, if this property belonged to the City.

On motion meeting adjourned.
