

Special Meeting of City Council

October 12, 1914.

Meeting called to order by W. H. Bair, Mayor, on roll call the following were present, Bair mayor, Hammond, recorder, Councilman Eckerson, Wang, Sutherland, White, Meeks and Stacy

Bids were opened on the City jail, after discussion, Motion made and seconded that the bid be rejected and that the Committee on Streets and Public Property and the City Recorder take the matter up and make changes in the plan and specifications so as to exclude undesirable features and change certain windows. and get new estimates on the work, carried.

Bid on four cross walks opened, Motion made that bid of Frank Dodge, for the sum of \$290.00 be accepted, and that the recorder have the contract signed.

Ordinance number 119 read and placed on it's final passage, being an amendment of Ordinance No. 90.

Ordinance number 120 read and placed on it's final passage, being an ordinance to levy the City tax for the year 1914, commonly known as the taxes of 1915.

Nayes, none.

Declared carried.

M. J. Lee at this time asked the Council to take up the consideration of a certain matter about a street in between Herman A. Lee's 2nd Addition to Canby and the R. R. right of way, asking that the City vacate the old county road at this point, as he said they had agreed to do, when the street was opened and the land dedicated

to the Public as a Street. Whereupon the following proceedings were had. A Motion was made, second and carried, That M. J. Lee could grade said street to the that place, under the direction of the Chief of Police, that the grading was to be done, if done on the piece of land that M. J. Lee desired graded and graveled, at the expense of M. J. Lee, with teams and workman provided by him; that the City of Canby should proceed to gravel and grade the remainder of the road past the said Heman A. Lee addition without further delay, but the work was to be done on said strip if prepared by M. J. Lee, That if said work was done on the strip of land desired by M. J. Lee, he should give to the City a piece of land to make the turn at the east end longer than the present turn. Carried.
