

Special Meeting of the City Council

November 19, 1914. Special meeting of the City Council called to order by the Mayor, on roll call the following council men were present. Eckerson, Wang, Gillmore, Sutherland, Hewett and Stacy.

The matter of bids for the construction of a city jail was taken up.

Motion made and second that all bids for the construction of the jail be rejected. Seconded, Carried.

Motion made that a contract be entered into with Frank Dodge, for the construction of a jail of concrete according to the revised plans and specifications, as changed by the Committee on Streets and Public Property, for the sum of \$625.00.

Roll call.

Nayes. None.

Declared carried.

Council man J. Lee Eckerson, reported he had made arrangements with Carlton & Rosenkrans to construct a false door through the horse shed behind the new City jail.

Council man Harry Gillmore, appointed a committee of one to attend to clearing ground, for the new City Jail building, and to see that everything was ready for the contractor to erect the same.
