Meeting called to order by the Mayor, William H. Bair, on roll call the following were present, The Mayor, William H. Bair, Recorder P. L. Hammond,, Chief of Police, Lieser, Councilmen, Eckerson, Gillmore, White, Stacy and Wang. *December 9, 1914.*

Recorder instructed to write warrants for said bills.

Motion made and second that mayor and Recorder be a committee to take up matter of concrete side walks with F. E. Dodge and make a settlement of the work under the contract, and upon completion of the work to pay F. E. Dodge, and to make such other arrangements as would be necessary to complete this work satisfactory to the City.

Council man Geo. Meeks arrives at the council meeting.

Moved and second that the contract of Meeks Bros, on the construction of wooden cross walks be accepted as offered by P. W. Meeks, as complete, and that the contractors be paid the amount of the contract price. Carried.

Ordinance numbered 122 read and placed on its final passage.

Ayes, Eckerson, Wang, Meeks, Hewett and White

Ordinance declared carried, and that the report of the viewers of Fair street be accepted, and that the recorder enter said ordinance on the ordinance book as said ordinance numbered 122.

Petition of the Methodist Episcople Church for the refund of certain wood which, was burned by certain tenants of the City Jail received.

Chief of Police reported wood was burned, that there was no wood at the City Jail,

Chief of Police instructed to purchase wood for jail and the Methodist Episcople church to put in bill for wood burned by tenants of the City Jail.

At this time the City Council canvassed the vote of the regular election held in the City of Canby, on December 7th, 1914, for the election of four council men and one treasurer of the City of Canby.

At this time licines for dogs in the City of Canby was called to the attention of the Council and the Chief of Police was instructed to collect this licince for all unlicined dogs.

Moved and seconded that a lights be placed on the Street corbers of B. & C Streets and the County Road, Roths Addition, in the City of Canby, which lights were to be similar to the lights now in use in the other parts of the City. Carried.

Recorder instructed to notify the Electric Light C^o.,

The Chief of Police was instructed to clean the street crossing, and to keep all concrete crossing in a clean condition so that persons might cross over the same, with out getting there shoes muddy.

It was moved that a committee be appointed to see property owners and see if they would pay there proportional costs of constructing a concrete gutter , around the C. & R. building past the Bank building and down 1st street to the Corvallis Creamery Station. Eckerson, Wang and Gillmore appointed and motion carried
