J A N . 7 ,   1914 .

Special call of the City Council made by Chairman of the Council, H.C.Gillmore.

Council was called to meet Jan. 7, 1914 at 11:00 o'clock A.M., the call having been made by Chairman of the Council, Gillmore, the Mayor being absent from the City. The object of the call was stated as follows "An army of about 100 men, laborers out of employment, would be in Canby before evening and that they desired shelter and food from the City, a kindness which Oregon City had shown them the night before.

Upon roll call the following responded to their names:- Chairman of the Council, H.C.Gillmore, Recorder, C. F. Romig; ~~Chairman of the Police~~, J. W. Lieser and Councilmen:- Grant White, J.L.Eckerson, L.H.Wang, Geo. Meeks, H. J. Hewett and P. O. Stacy.

After some discussion, motion was made that the City Hall be given them in which place they might sleep and that J. W. Leiser be put in charge and purchase bread, meat and other necessary provisions and also receive any contributions which might be offered, and that he care for this body of men. Motion carried.

Council adjourned.
