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REGULAR SESSION OF CITY COUNCIL
MONDAY EVENING, FEBRUARY 2, 1914.

Council was called to order at 8:00 o'clock P.M. by Mayor, W. H. Bair

Upon roll call the following were found present: Mayor, W. H. Bair, Recorder, C. F. Romig, Chief of Police, J. W. Lieser, Councilmen; H.C.Gillmore J. L. Eckerson, Grant White, J. E. Sutherland, L. H. Wang, H. J. Hewett, Geo. Weeks and P.O.Stacy.

Under communications, a letter from Att'y H. E. Cross was read in which he presented a claim against the city for \$14.25 on account of Telford vs City of Canby. Bill was referred by the mayor to Att'y Hammond to be taken up at next meeting accompanied by his report on same.

The following claims against the City were then presented:-

Motion made by Councilman Eckerson, seconded by Councilman Gillmore that bills be allowed and warrants ordered drawn to pay same, whereupon the roll was called with the result that all(except Councilman Gillmore voted) for the motion. Whereupon the Recorder was instructed to send an itemized bill of expenses of harboring "The Hungry Hundred" to Mayor Saddler of Aurora, as they agreed to pay one-half of same.

Under reports, the Treasurers report was read. Motion was made that it be accepted and as soon as audited it be placed on file. Motion carried.

Councilman Gillmore made a report of the condition of the telephone wiring, sighting its unsafe condition and advising an ordinance drafted to regulate all matters pertaining to telephone lines, electric lines and wiring; whereupon motion was made, seconded and carried, That the Committee on Streets and Public Property act in conjunction with the City Attorney in drafting an ordinance to regulate phone and electric lines in the City of Canby.

It was then suggested by different councilmen that lights were requested or needed as follows: one at the Cottage Hotel, One near Mr. Sannes corner, another near Davenport's and a fourth along the R.R.

below Snell's. Motion made that three lights, one near Davenport's, one near Sannes' Cor. and one below Snells' be put up by the Chief of Police if the cost in the opinion of the Com. on Streets and Public Property would not be too great; motion carried.

Subject of the unsanitary condition of a number of toilets in Canby was presented by Councilman White. Motion was then made and carried that the Committee on Health and Police canvass the town and have all such placed cleaned up.

Motion made that an ordinance be drawn to comply with our charter combining the offices of Street & Chief of Police. Motion Carried. Att'y Hammond was designated to act in conjunction with the Committee on Streets and Public Property in drawing up this ordinance.

Motion made that the Recorder draft an ordinance pursuant with the opening of a new street connecting the road East of the Fair Grounds with the R.R. crossing leading to the Fair Ground and that this new street hereafter be called Fair Street, motion carried.

Thereupon the Council proceeded with the election of the elective officers. First the Council balloted on the President of the Council with the following results:- Councilman J.L.Eckerson 4, Councilman H. C. Gillmore 3 and Councilman L. H. Wang 1, whereupon Mayor Bair declared that there was no election and that a second ballot be taken with the following results: Councilman J.L.Eckerson 5 and Councilman H.C.Gillmore 3, whereupon Councilman J.L.Eckerson was declared elected.

The next ballot was for Recorder, which resulted unanimously for C.F.Romig, eight ballots have been cast; therefore C.F.Romig was elected.

The ballot for City Att'y resulted in Phil Hammond 7, J.A.Cobb 1, whereupon Mr. Hammond was declared elected.

For City engineer, F.M.Roth received an unanimous vote and was therefore declared elected.

Among other subjects mentioned were; a general clean up of the town, a concrete jail and bell for fire alarm. Motion made and carried that the Mayor secure electric appliances for fire alarm.

The Street Commissioner was instructed to remove mud from the streets.

Motion was then made that Council adjourn subject to the call of the Mayor. Motion carried.
