Motion made and carried that claims be allowed and warrants be drawn on the treasurer for same (vote being taken by calling the roll, all voting, yes).

There was some discussion relative to the quality of the material being used in the crossings, which were being put in; whereupon Mr. Adam Knight requested a crossing at the alley adjoining his property and offered to put same in, if the City would furnish the lumber. Thereupon motion was made and carried unanimously that lumber be provided for said crossing.

Motion was made, seconded and carried that the ordinance covering the unsanitary condition of toilets be enforced and that the Recorder notify all persons owning property in the platted portion of the City and such others as should be found necessary that the toilets be put at once into a sanitary condition and that where water was available that septic tanks be installed.

Complaint was presented by Andrew Kocher and others about the keeping and standing of stallions in town. Motion was made, seconded and carried that all owners of stallions must take them to the Clackamas County Fair Grounds to breed mares and that the Recorder and Chief of Police notify the parties concerned and see that this order be enforced.

Ordinance #114, relative to the accepting of the City Engineers report in regard to opening Fair Street, be placed on final passage: whereupon said ordinance #114 was read and the roll was called and all voted, yes.

Motion made, seconded and carried that this ordinance be posted, the following being the result upon roll call:- J.L.Eckerson, yes; H. C. Gillmore, yes; Grant White, yes; L. H. Wang, no; Geo. Meeks, yes, whereupon motion was declared carried.

Ordinance #114 relative to the opening Fair Street ( said road connecting the road East of the Fair Grounds with the R.R. crossing now existing to said County Fair Grounds) was read for first time, and upon motion (the roll being called) it was ordered that this ordinance be published in the Canby Irrigator.

Ordinance #116 defining the duties of Chief of Police was upon motion tabled until next meeting.

Motion made that Ordinance #. 72 be revised by the City Att'y to read 16 years of age instead of minors. Motion carried.

The City Council of the City of Canby, Ore. met in regular session in the City Hall, at 8:00 o'clock P.M. on Monday, Apr. 6, 1914 and was called to order by Mayor, W. H. Bair.

Upon roll call the following were found present, to-wit:- Mayor, W. H. Bair; Recorder, C. F. Romig; Chief of Police, J. W. Lieser; Councilmen, J. L. Eckerson, H. C. Gillmore, L. H. Wang, H. J. Hewett, Grant White, J. E. Sutherland, Geo. Meeks & P.O. Stacy.

Minutes of the previous meeting read, approved and ordered placed on file.

Under communications, letters, that were received from various firms, offering to supply us with a front and 2 solid steel partitions, bunks (one for each cell, 3 in all) and 3 soil buckets for 3 jail cells, were read. The prices quoted ranged from \$180.00 to \$290.00. Motion was made, seconded and carried that E.T. Barnum Iron Works' \$180.00 proposition be accepted, if they deliver material F.O.B. Canby, and if not then the Committee on Streets and Public Property be authorized to place the order where they might see fit and proper.

Motion was then made, seconded and carried that the Mayor,
