

REGULAR SESSION OF THE CITY COUNCIL, Monday, June 1, 1914.

The Council met in regular session June 1, 1914 at the City Hall and was called to order by Mayor, W. H. Bair. Upon roll call the following responded, to-wit: Mayor, W. H. Bair; Recorder, C. F. Romig; Chief of Police, J. W. Lieser; Councilmen, J. L. Eckerson, H. C. Gillmore, J. E. Sutherland, H. J. Hewett and Grant White.

Minutes of May 4th, read, approved and ordered placed on record. Under communications, the resignation of C. F. Romig, as Recorder on account of his moving from the City, was read and upon motion was accepted. Report of the Viewers of Fair Street was read, in which report the damages of \$125.00 was assessed Roscoe Mack and benefits of \$25.00 were assessed. Motion was made, seconded and carried that this report be laid on the table.

Motion made, seconded and carried that the claims be allowed and warrants be ordered drawn for same (the vote being taken by calling the roll) was unanimously carried.

Whereupon the Recorder reported that almost \$100.00 had been subscribed toward oil for oiling the streets.

M. J. Lee then presented an ordinance requesting an electric light franchise, but as the lights were poor and the recorder desired to attend the alumni banquet given by the high school, motion was made, seconded and carried that this ordinance be placed on the table.

Motion was made, seconded and carried that a table and railing be purchased by the Committee on Streets & Public Property.

Complaints were then made of cows running at large and destroying gardens; also complaint was again made regarding the filthy and unsanitary condition of some closets.

Motion made, seconded and carried that the Council proceed to elect a Recorder, whereupon a ballot was prepared, which resulted unanimously in favor of Phil Hammond (there having been 5 votes cast).
