

ADJURNED MEETING OF THE COUNCIL, Monday, June 8, 1914.

The council met in an adjourned session June 8, 1914 at the city Hall, and was called to order by the Mayor H.W. Bair, upon roll call the following responded, Bair, mayor, Hammond, recorder, Lissner, Chief of Police, Councilmen, Eekerson, Sutherland, White, Mesks and Stacy..

Ordinance No. 115, relative to granting a franchise to M. J. Lee, was discussed and read.

Motion made and second and carried, that said ordinance be published at full length in the Canby Irrigator.

The Mayor, Chief of Police and recorder were named a committee to see that all parts of the new jail had arrived and to pay the freight on the same if satisfactory.

The Com. of Streets & Public property was ordered to investigate and determine if the steel was of the quality as represented by the Barium Iron Works, and to make plans for the erection of the new jail building.

The Fire Department was then discussed and Chief of Police ordered to investigate and see if the fire apparatus was in good working order.

Motion made and second that the meeting adjourn.
