

## REGULAR MEETING OF THE CITY COUNCIL, Monday, July 6, 1914.

The council met in regular session July 6, 1914 at the City Hall and was called to order by J.L. Eckerson, President of the Council, upon roll call the following responded, recorder, Hammond, Lieser, Chief of Police; Councilmen, Eckerson, Gillmore, Sutherland, Hewett and Meeks.

Meetings of the previous meeting read and approved.

The matter of having First Street lit with Hydrogen lamps and having the fire bell rapped for an electric hammer, was referred to the Recorder, to take up with the Molalla Electric and to obtain there charges for so doing.

The recorder was instructed to write to the S. P. Co. in regard to the excessive speed of trains through the City of Canby also in regard to lights at the depot, and of oiling the R.R. property.

Ordinance No. 116 was read and on motion made and second and carried order posted to come up for final passage at a special meeting of the Council Wednesday July 23, 1914.

Ordinance No. 115 was read and on motion made and second, and the roll called; carried unannouncedly, and declared passed.

Grass on the City Streets was discussed and the Chief of Police ordered to cut all grass in the Streets.

C Street was discussed and Meeks, Stacy and Gillmore made a committee to confer with Mr. Telford in regard to the same,

the Recorder was instructed to arrange for the time at which a meeting between the Committee and Mr Telford could take place.

City jail discussed, City recorder instructed to write State Engineer in regard to plans for the building.

The City Recorder instructed to publish the report of the viewers of Fair Street in the Canby Irrigator.
