

## Regular Meeting of the City Council.

Meeting called to order by the Mayor, September 8, 1914, on motion meeting adjourned to September 14, 1914, at the regular time, 8 P. M., no quorum being present.

September 14, 1914.

Meeting called to order by the Mayor, W. H. Bair, on roll call the following were present, Mayor, Bair, Recorder, Hammond Councilmen, Eckerson, Gillmore, Sutherland, Hewett, Meeks and Stacy.

Petition granted that City furnish three lights and fixtures, but no wires or poles, at the following places, Warrenstaff corner; near the Flohr place at the intersection of the streets and one half way between.

The Road leading out of town, known as the Cementary road was ordered fixed, being the two hundred feet at the City Limits. Also road near Brown's Warehouse, was ordered re-graded.

Side-walks near Brown's Warehouse and across S. P. Cot property on C. Street, reported in bad shape, and recorded ordered to inform owners to have them fixed.

City Attorney instructed to obtain from the County Court the money paid to the County of Clackamas in Taxes in the past ten years, if possible.

Motion made and second that the City Recorder purchase a docket for the Recorder's Court. Carried.

Report of the proceedings of the Recorder's Court read. Claims against the City read.

J. L. Eckerson and John Graham were elected by the council police men, John Graham to serve as night watch during the fair, J. L. Eckerson was detailed to serve at the band hall during dances.

Ordinance Number 116, read and placed on its final passage.

Recorder instructed to prepare plan and specifications for four cross walks, located as follows, on 1st Street across B and D Streets on 2nd St. across C Street, on C Street across 2nd Street, and for a concrete Jail, to be located behind the City Hall. Notice of Call of bids to be advertised in the Canby Paper, bids to in the recorders hands, by September 28th, 1914.

Motion made that the City Council meet in special meeting, September 28th, 1914, at 8 P. M. to open bids. carried.
