

Regular Session of the City Council.

Sept. 3, 1913.

Council met in regular session at 8:00 o'clock Sept. 3, 1913 at the City Hall and was called to order by Mayor H. A. Dedman.

The following responded, present upon roll call: Mayor H. A. Dedman, Recorder C. F. Romig, Chief of Police Joe Lieser; Councilmen: H. C. Gillmore, J. L. Southland and H. J. Hewett, W. H. Bair and L. H. Wang.

Minutes of Aug. 4 and Aug. 25, 1913 read and approved.

Letter from Standard Oil Co. quoting prices for oil by bbl. was read, but as the rain had settled the dust no order for oil was made.

Motion made by Councilman Wang seconded by Councilman Gill more that the bills be allowed and warrants be drawn on the treasurer for same. The roll was called and everyone voted yes.

Motion made by Councilman Bair seconded by Councilman Gill more that - the Elite Amusement Co. be granted the use of chairs of the hall for a period of two months & that - there be no license fee charged in addition to the rental of \$20.00 per month for the City Hall for this object.

Ordinance No. 112, relative to the construction of sidewalks, was read for the second time, whereupon motion was made by Councilman Bair, seconded by Councilman Gillmore that this Ordinance be placed on its final passage. The roll was then called & the motion carried unanimously.

Arrangements for the Police force at the Fair was discussed & it was suggested that if it would be acceptable with the Fair Assn that our Chief of Police have general oversight of the Police force.

Motion was made by Councilman Bair seconded by Councilman Eckerson that the property holders on the West side of A as far as and including Third Street, on the North side of First, as far as and including E Street on both sides of B, C, D & E Streets as far as and including Third Street - and on both sides of Second & Third Streets from A to E Street - where ever sidewalks do not exist; and that sixty days be given from the date of this meeting in which to lay a suitable walks, complying with ordinance # 83 as amended.
