

Regular Session of Council Nov. 3, 1913.
The City Council met in regular session
in the City Hall, at 8:00 P.M. Nov. 3, 1913
and was called to order by Pres. of

Again motion was made that the rules be suspended & the Chief of Police cast the ballot. Motion carried & the ballot was cast & Messrs. Stacy & Baty were declared clerks of the City Election to be held

Dec 1 1913. Recorder was instructed to post election notices on city hall property.

When upon ordinance was read assessing a $7\frac{1}{2}$ mill tax levy, and upon motion was approved and ordered posted & printed.

The subject of the condition of sidewalk on B St. by Wang's Store was discussed and it was moved, seconded & carried That notice be sent Mr. Zollner to repair or build a new walk on or before Dec. 1.

Request was made through Councilman Bair That M. J. Lee be given an extension of time in which to put in sidewalk as ordered by the City. Similar such requests were made by F. M. Roth, Mr. Wait, Mr. Beermore, when upon motion was made seconded and carried That an extension of three weeks be granted these & any others who have not the walks completed & That Mr. Sturgis be notified to put in walk as ordered along lots which he recently purchased in the Roth addition.

The matter of putting in cement crossings was then discussed and it was decided That cement crossings were almost as cheap as wood & considering that they lasted indefinitely That they should be put in on all the principal streets. Motion was then made ^{seconded} & carried That Cement crossings be put in between the Bank and the Mercantile Store, between Wang's Store & the livery barn ^{on 1st Street} between Bair's new residence & Bradth's on 3rd St. and That the grading be done on D St when curbing is proposed.

Recorder was instructed to notify the Aurora Electric Co. also the Telephone Co. to remove poles on B. St. opposite Block #12 out of the way where side
