Motion made by Councilman Eckerson, seconded by Councilman Graham that the bills be allowed and warrants ordered drawn to pay same, whereupon the roll was called and every councilman present voted yes as his name was called, (W. J. Hewitt being the only absent Councilman). Therefore the motion was declared carried.

Under the head of Committee's Reports; Councilman Gillmore took the floor and made inquiry as to the reason the ditch by Kesselrings & Davenport, which was an important ditch for draining, had been filled and appropriated for the laying of water pipes. Other councilmen spoke of needed street-improvements, but no action was taken.

Then the tally sheets & and reports of the judges & clerks of the City Election were read, showing that at the City Election held, Monday, Dec. 1, 1913 the following was the result:

And for Councilmen (four to be elected) as follows:— H. C. Gillmore 81, P. O. Stacy 80, D. Wamstaff 34, Ole W. Ogle 26, J. E. Sutherland 52, Geo. Weeks 53, John Graham 1, C. G. Combs 1,

whereupon after the canvass was made motion was made, seconded and carried unanimously that W. H. Bair be declared the Mayor elected for a term of two years, that L. D. Walker be declared the Treasurer elected for a term of one year and that H. C. Gillmore, P. O. Stacy, J. E. Sutherland and Geo. Weeks be declared the four Councilmen, each elected for a term of two years.

M. J. Lee & others requested an extension of time in which to put in sidewalk walks, whereupon the Council granted ^{an extension} until Jan. 1st 1914 to all who had been requested and ordered to put down walks.

After this the subject of securing a R.R. Crossing ~~from~~ near the Fair Grounds to accommodate the settlers of the Carby Gardens, who at present are compelled to travel considerably out of their way in order to reach town. After much discussion motion was made by Councilman Wang, seconded by Councilman Graham that the Recorder draft an ordinance providing for the purchase of a strip of land from O. R. Mack to connect with the present Fair Grounds Crossing. When motion was put some voted no, some yes while others failed to vote at all, whereupon Acting Mayor Gillmore ordered the roll call with
