

Regular Session of City Council Feb. 3, 1913.

The City Council met at the City Hall at 8:00 P.M. in regular session Monday evening Feb. 3, 1913 and was called to order by Mayor H. A. Dedman.

Upon roll call the following were found present: Mayor, H. A. Dedman, Recorder, C. F. Romig, Chief of Police, E. C. Skull and Councilmen - H. C. Gillmore, John Graham, H. J. Hewitt, W. H. Bair and L. N. Wang.

Messrs Richardson and Clark explained at length plans and specifications that they had gotten up for the enlargement of and making the present water system in Carby more effective. They estimated that they would want the city to subscribe for about twenty five public hydrants for fire protection at an annual expense of about \$4000 each or at a total expense to the city of about \$1000 per annum.

The minutes of the previous meeting was read and approved.

The annual reports of the City Treasurer and the Recorder were then read (these reports being for the year 1912 and ending Dec. 31, 1912) approved and placed on file upon motion.

Motion made by Councilman S. H. Wang, seconded by Councilman W. H. Bair that bills be allowed, whereupon the roll was called and all Councilmen present (5 in number voted yes).

Under the head of reports of Committees Councilman Gillmore stated that complaint had been made against Mr. Kaufman's duck & hog yard, whereupon Chief of Police was instructed to investigate & if the complaint was just to see that the yard be properly cleaned.

Ord. # 111, relative to the road through the gravel pit was read for the second time and upon motion was placed on final passage. Upon roll call all present voted yes.

The subject of street lights in different sections of the town was then discussed and the Recorder was instructed to notify Mr. Hurst to put some in as they should be designated by the Street Committee.

Councilman W. H. Bair urged that the work be pushed forward immediately on the road through the gravel pit.

Motion made and carried that a committee of three be appointed by the Mayor to look over this road, get the estimate of probable cost, investigate ways & means; whereupon Councilmen S. H. Wang, W. H. Bair and N. C. Gillmore were appointed.

The subject of an improper use of the bicycle path leading North of Town was introduced & discussed & the Recorder was requested to find out the law covering same.

A complaint about an open ditch in front of the Blue Front Store was entered and it was ordered by motion that the closing of it should be & that ten days be given in which to do it, otherwise it would be done by the City & charged to the proper parties.
