

May 5, 1913.

The regular session of the City Council met in the City Hall at 8:00 o'clock P.M., May 5, 1913 by Mayor H. A. Dedman

Upon roll call the following responded:— Mayor H. A. Dedman; Recorder C. F. Roring; Councilmen: J. L. Eckerson, John Graham, H. J. Hewitt, W. H. Bair, L. H. Wang and Grant White.

Minutes of April 10, 1913, read approved and ordered placed on file.

Under the head of communications: a letter from the Supt. of the Water Dept. of Woodburn was read, in which they offered to sell certain parts of unused water supplies.

Motion made by Councilman J. L. Eckerson, seconded by Councilman L. H. Wang, That bills be allowed and warrants be ordered drawn on the Treasurer for same, whereupon the roll was called, all voting, and unanimously carrying the motion.

After Mr. Hurst, our electrician, reported that a higher voltage lamp would give us longer service.

A motion was made & carried that our Acting Chief of Police, J. W. Lieser order lamps of 120 or 125 voltage in standard packages 60 watt size through Mr. Hurst. Motion Carried.

Heath & Police Committee Then called the attention of the Council

to the condition in which they found the toilets. This Committee also reported the drinking fountain out of repair & the pump at Waukegan in bad condition, whereupon the Committee on Health & Police was given authority to adjust ^{matters} and make necessary repairs.

The condition of the City Park was introduced by Councilman W. H. Bair and upon motion the Recorder was instructed to turn the care of it over to Mr. J. R. Newton, and the City would settle for the work done on it.

It was ordered that the Street Committee see to filling up of B Street where it needed it.

Recorder was authorized to order Sebastian Baine to put gravel for walk in front of property between E and F Street.

Recorder was also ordered to notify those who have failed to put walks in the Roth Addition, where they had been ordered.
