

Minutes of the Regular Session of The City Council Aug. 4, 1913.

The City-Council met in regular session at 8:00 P.M. Aug. 4, 1913 at the City Hall and was called to order by Mayor H. A. Dedman.

Upon roll call the following were found present: Mayor H. A. Dedman, Recorder C. F. Rowing, Chief of Police Joe Luser; Councilmen: H. C. Gillmore, J. L. Eckerson, John Graham, W. H. Beir and L. H. Wang.

The minutes of the meeting of July 7th 1913 were read and approved.

Whereupon motion was made, seconded and carried unanimously (the roll having been called) that these claims be allowed and that warrants be ordered drawn on the Treasurer to pay same.

Request was made by Councilman Bair to Park ~~11th~~ street in front of place, it was unanimously granted.

The matter of cleaning up back of old hotel was brought up and by consent it was decided to have the cleaning done at once. It was urged by Councilman Bair that all lots and toilets in town should be looked after & ordered cleaned.

Recorder ordered to inquire at what rate oil by Bbl. might be obtained to do additional oiling of streets.

Motion made seconded and carried that Sec. 2 of Ordinance #83 (which reads as follows: All sidewalks on 1st, 2nd, 3rd, 4th, 5th A, B, C, D, E, F & G Streets shall be of an even width of 8 feet) be changed to read as follows: All sidewalks on 1st, 2nd, 3rd, 4th, 5th, A, B, C, D, E, F and G Streets shall be not more than eight feet or less than six feet at the discretion of the Council & that this ordinance be posted by the Recorder.
