

Minutes of Council Meeting Aug 5, 1912.

The City Council met in regular session Aug. 5, 1912 at the City Hall and was called to order at 8:00 P.M. by Mayor H. A. Dedman.

Upon roll call the following responded to wit:— Mayor H. A. Dedman, Recorder C. F. Romig, Chief of Police, E. C. Shull, Councilmen, H. C. Gillmore, Joe Liseser, John Graham, J. E. Southland and Geo. Weeks.

Minutes of the previous Council read, approved and placed on file.

Whereupon the following claims against the City were presented and upon motion were allowed, the following voting yes as their names were called: H. C. Gillmore, Joe Liseser, John Graham, J. E. Southland and Geo. Weeks.

Under the order of business of reports of Committees; Councilman Geo. Weeks called attention to the unsanitary condition of the tank where the public water is kept.

Motion made that— 75- or 100 feet of tiling be put in the ditch draining the waste water from the Creamery and that portion of the street— near the

crannery and that the work be done at office.

The mayor referred this matter to the street committee and the Street Commissioner with instructions to put in the pipe.

Then the following resolution was offered by Councilman J. E. Southerland: "Be it resolved that in the time limited for appeal relative to the widening of Front Street of Canby, Oregon, and since all the necessary steps have been taken as provided by the Charter of said City of Canby, the Recorder be directed to enter in the docket of City liens the respective sums of damages over benefits, so assessed by the Viewers, C. L. Bates, Chas. J. Roth and John Eid, which report was legally published after approval by the Council of Canby and afterwards embodied in an ordinance and passed by said council, such report allowing the following benefits, to-wit: - Ed Sumnerfield, damages over benefits \$40.00; W. Cantwell, damages over benefits for moving buildings, fence, etc. \$45.00; K. Nelson, damages moving buildings, fence, etc. \$35.00 & that warrants be drawn in favor of the above persons for the respective amounts assessed to them as damages above benefits from the general municipal fund."

Upon motion made by Councilman J. E. Southerland and seconded by Councilman H. C. Gillmore the above resolution was unanimously passed by the members of the Council present, the following Councilmen being present and voting yes, when their names were called: - H. C. Gillmore, Joe Liser, John Graham, J. E. Southerland and Geo. Meeks.

Following this motion was made and carried, that whatever expenses there might be in taking over this property for the street, such expenses be paid out of the City funds.

and that until Nov. 1st be given the owners from whom the land is appropriated for the street in which to gather their crops and that then or after then possession be taken of the property appropriated for the widening of Fairbank Street.

Whereupon no other business having come before the Council motion was made and carried that the Council adjourn.
